PM Modi enquires about AP flood situation, assures Naidu of all help

Amaravati: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday assured Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu of all possible help from the Centre to deal with the crisis following heavy rains in the State. Modi spoke to Naidu over phone to enquire about the prevailing flood situation in the State where several places, Vijayawada being one of the worst affected, are being pounded by heavy rainfall for the past two days

"Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu explained about the ongoing flood relief work while Modi told him that Central government departments concerned have been directed to extend necessary help to the State," said an official statement released by the State government late Sunday. The Prime Minister said departments have also been instructed to immediately dispatch necessary equipment, it said and added that Naidu thanked Modi for the help. Earlier on Sunday, Naidu asked the Centre for additional National Disaster Response Force teams, power boats and helicopters to intensify relief operations.

Meanwhile, the Secunderabad-headquartered South Central Railway (SCR) zone, which also includes the Vijayawada Division, cancelled 140 trains and diverted 97 more on Sunday. Nearly 6,000 passengers were provided with breakfast and drinking water at Rayanapadu, Kondapalli, Tenali, Vijayawada, Nidubrolu and Bapatla railway stations. The Chennai-bound Tamil Nadu Express was halted at Rayanapadu railway station and its passengers were provided with packed food items, along with lunch arrangements. Besides setting up emergency control rooms and helplines, the railways also made alternative travel provisions by arranging buses from Rayanapaud to Vijayawada and Kondapalli to Vijayawada. As many as 84 buses were arranged. Telangana's Survapeta Superintendent of Police Sunpreet Singh advised people heading to Vijayawada and Khammam to postpone their journeys due to the inclement weather. "Due to heavy rains, water is flowing on NH 65 at Chillakallu and Nandigama of Andhra Pradesh limits, and the Paleru river is overflowing on the road at Nayakinigudem on the way from Suryapet to Khammam," said Singh in a press release.

Strategic Nala Development Programme saved Hyderabad from floods, says KTR

Hyderabad: Former Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister and BRS working president KT Rama Rao said on Monday that the Strategic Nala Development Programme (SNDP) implemented by the previous BRS government was the key reason why Hyderabad was spared from major flooding despite the heavy rains in the last few days.

In a statement, Rama Rao said the SNDP, initiated by former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao, provided a permanent solution to the perennial flooding issue in Hyderabad. Despite the incessant downpours, lowlying areas of the city did not experience the usual waterlogging, which he attributed to the success of the SNDP. Residents of the flood-affected areas have acknowledged that the SNDP was instrumental in protecting them from the deluge, he said, expressing gratitude to all those who were part of the SNDP implementation.

Pointing out that in the erstwhile State, heavy rains and floods would inundate low-lying areas of Hyderabad, he said the KCR government had identified the issue and conceived the SNDP as a comprehensive solution. Under the SNDP, the State government undertook 60 major works worth Rs.985 crore to strengthen the city's stormwater and sewage infrastructure. This proactive measure ensured that Hyderabad was spared from the flood crisis, even without any financial assistance from the Centre.Rama Rao said the SNDP involved the rapid development of 36 key nalas (drainage channels) that would otherwise overflow with even minor rainfall. The fact that these areas did not witness waterlogging despite the recent heavy downpours was a testament to the success of the SNDP, as confirmed by the residents themselves. Under the erstwhile Greater Municipal Corporation of Hyderabad, the stormwater and sewage systems were in a dilapidated condition, leading to the merging of the two systems and creating an overall chaotic situation. As part of the SNDP, the restoration of old nalas and construction of new ones were undertaken on a war footing, he recalled, conveying his appreciation to all stakeholders who were involved in the implementation of the

16 dead in rain-related incidents, Telangana govt urges Centre to declare floods as national calamity

At least 16 people lost their lives in various rainrelated incidents, while some persons were still missing during the current spell of heavy rainfall in Telangana even as Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy decided to urge the Centre to declare the floods in the state as a national calamity. State IT and Industries Minister D Sridhar Babu told reporters that full details would be known after reports on the extent of damage were received.Revanth Reddy,

who reviewed the rain situation with officials here, announced an ex-gratia of Rs five lakh each to the kin of those who were killed in rain-related incidents, a press release said. The state government will sub-



mit a comprehensive report on the flood damage to the Centre, it said. The government will write a letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi requesting him to visit the flood-affected areas in the state and also urging the Centre to declare the floods in Telangana as a national calamity. KTR slams Rahul Gandhi over Congress failure in Telangana

Hyderabad: BRS working president KT Rama Rao on Monday questioned Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's remarks on the Telangana government's response to the floods here, and said the Congress leadership in the State had actually failed to deliver on its responsibilities during the ongoing crisis. Unlike Gandhi's claims of 'tireless efforts', he said the State government's performance was marked by inadequate relief efforts and lack of accountability."Rahul Ji, your government and the Chief Minister have failed the people of Telangana and their mandate," Rama Rao said, adding that it was not enough for him to merely urge action. Gandhi must ensure that the Congress government in Telangana takes effective relief efforts and take responsibility for the disaster, he said, charging the Congress party with shattering Telangana's vision due to its neglect, leading to a growing loss of faith among the people. "If you truly care about Telangana as much as you claim, these many instances of gross negligence and deliberate harm wouldn't be happening," he said. The BRS leader also questioned the purpose of an elected government if people were left to fend for themselves during such crisis. "The onus of this systematic failure is on the Congress Party. If people have to fend for themselves and pray for a miracle instead of receiving timely aid, what is the point of an elected government?" he questioned.

S C says law does not allow bulldozing of homes of accused, their kins; proposes framing uniform, pan-India guidelines

The Supreme Court on Monday (September 2, 2024) questioned the bulldozing of homes and private properties of persons accused of crimes or even their relatives by States as a possible act of public retribution, saying the law does not permit the destruction of the family shelters of even convicts. "How can anybody's home be demolished because he is an accused in a case? The law does not permit that... Can it happen even if a person is a convict?" Justice B.R. Gavai, heading a Bench with Justice K.V. Viswanathan, asked.Senior advocate Dushyant Dave, appearing for the petitioner side along with senior advocate C.U. Singh, urged the court to make a statement that "bulldozer justice will not be meted out anywhere in the country". Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, for the Uttar Pradesh government which has been blamed for retributory demolitions, said municipal laws provide for the demolition of illegal structures.Mr. Mehta denied targetted, communal or retributive demolitions by States. He said the States follow the law. Demolitions happened after complying with statutory procedure. The law officer said even the government was against retributive demolitions of accused persons' or their families' homes and properties. That was not permitted under the law. However, he urged the court to consider an alternative to the petitioners' narrative.

Mr. Mehta asked what if a person, accused of a crime, had already been facing a notice from the municipal authorities, warning him that his illegal structure was

bound to be demolished. If he has a pending notice, he will not be absolved because he happens to be an accused in a crime. From the facts gleaned in many cases, notices had been sent to these persons. They later happened to be accused in crimes," Mr. Mehta countered.

Justice Gavai acknowledged that municipal laws do provide for demolition of illegal constructions, but they seem to be implemented "more in breach". "We are not protecting any unauthorised structures, may it even be temples..." Justice Gavai remarked. Mr. Mehta intervened to say "any religious structures". Justice Gavai underscored that "immoveable properties can be demolished only in accordance with procedure laid down in law". Justice Viswanathan said the apex court was intending to lay down uniform guidelines on a pan-India basis to streamline the procedure for identifying unauthorised structures, issuing notice to persons concerned, giving them a fair hearing and subsequent action. "If we lay down guidelines, even digitalise the process, neither authorities nor the persons concerned can take advantage," Justice Viswanathan said. The court listed the case on September 17 for laying down guidelines. It asked petitioners to provide it with suggestions. The petitioners had highlighted the recent cases of demolitions in Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan.In Madhya Pradesh, a family's ancestral home was pulled down. In Udaipur, the municipal corporation demolished a tenant's house for allegedly 'encroaching' on forest land. The razing of the house had followed shortly after the tenant's 15-year-old son was arrested for allegedly stabbing his classmate from another community, leading to communal tensions in the city. The last time the court heard the case in 2022, Mr. Dave, appearing for Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind, had said the court should view the problem from a larger perspective. He said the country was a facing an "extraordinarily serious" situation. Justice was being delivered by the arms of the bulldozer. Rule of law lay in the debris.Mr. Dave had argued that powerful State governments and its functionaries were taking advantage of municipal laws to "wreck vengeance" by using bulldozers to demolish the private homes and buildings of people whom they believe were behind communal violence and

'If Tanaji Sawant is not sacked, we should quit Mahayuti': NCP spokesperson Umesh Patil hits out after minister's jibe

tanaji sawantSpeaking at a public event on Thursday, Sawant, who belongs to the Shiv Sena led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, said, "I have never got along with Congress and NCP all my life. In the Cabinet meeting, when I sit next to each other, I come out of the meeting and vomit." Maharashtra Health Minister Tanaji Sawant's remark that he "vomits" after sitting with Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) ministers during Cabinet meetings has ruffled feathers in Alit Pawar's party with spokesperson Umesh Patil demanding that the Shiv Sena leader be sacked. "Either he stays or the NCP. If he is not sacked, we should guit the Mahayuti Cabinet. I request our national president Ajit Pawar and all our senior leaders to quit the Cabinet," Patil told on Friday. Pawar should not attend any Cabinet meeting till Sawant is sacked, Patil added. "Even our ministers should boycott Cabinet meetings till Sawant is sacked. We will not accept Sawant's apology or statement that he was misinterpreted. We want him out immediately," Patil said.

Speaking at a public event on Thursday, Sawant, who belongs to the Shiv Sena led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, said, "I have never got along with Congress and NCP all my life. In the Cabinet meeting, when I sit next to each other, I come out of the meeting and vomit."Shiv Sena spokesperson Naresh Mhaske refused to comment on the matter. "This is not my subject," he said.

Patil said the NCP was not desperate for power. "We cannot work with a minister who makes such a disparaging comment. He is not a minister who deserves to be in the Mahayuti Cabinet...he should be sacked immediately," said Patil.

Hitting out at Sawant, Patil said, "I don't remember any politician in the country who has made such humiliating comments against fellow politicians. Sawant is a cruel man at heart. If he is allowed to continue, it will tarnish the image of politicians. People will not allow politicians to purchase flats in their societies or live amidst them."Meanwhile, reacting to Sawant's remarks, Mahesh Tapase, the chief spokesperson of the NCP (SP), expressed disbelief at how Ajit Pawar's party was tolerating such an insult."I never imagined that Ajit Dada, who once commanded immense respect within the NCP, would compromise his self-respect for power," Tapase said, criticising Ajit Pawar's decision to break away from Sharad Pawar's party, saying it appeared to have led to public humiliation rather than political gain.

Tapase pointed out that Sawant's remarks reflected the growing discomfort among Shinde Sena members over Ajit Pawar's inclusion into the government. He also questioned the silence of senior NCP leaders like Praful Patel, Chhagan Bhujbal, and Sunil Tatkare. "Sawant's statement has effectively erased Ajit Dada's political standing, and yet, his own party members remain silent," Tapase said. He also took potshots at Bhujbal's assertion that Ajit Pawar's NCP would secure 80 to 90 seats in the upcoming Assembly elections in the state. "Given the current state of affairs, Ajit Dada's NCP might not even secure 25 seats, and it's this desperation that has led to such humiliating treatment,"

Tapase added. Tapase said sitting next to Ajit Pawar used to be a matter of pride among party cadres when Ajit Pawar was with Sharad Pawar's NCP. "Today, it is disheartening to see him endure such indignity," Tapase said, hinting that Sawant's words likely reflect the sentiments of CM Shinde and Deputy Chief Minister Devendra

MSRTC gets nod to convert 5,000 diesel buses to LNG

In tune with the state government's green transit plan, the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC) plans to convert 5,000 diesel-run buses to Liquified Natural Gas (LNG) on Monday. As part of the same initiative, the Pune division will receive 250 electric buses by March next year. The initiative, announced by the Deputy Chief Minister in the 2023-2024 budget speech, has now received a green signal from the home department. The conversion process, which will span four years, is set to receive a total funding of Rs 970 crore.

The allocation will be disbursed over four financial years, from 2024-25 to 2027-28. The initial amount allocated in the year 2024-25 will be Rs 40 crore, which will increase to Rs 200 crore in FY 2025-26. The amount will then grow to Rs 370 crore in FY 2026-27 and Rs 360 crore in FY 2027-28. Pramod Nehul, an MSRTC official in the Pune division, said that as part of the initiative to adopt green mobility solutions, MSRTC plans to add 5,150 electric buses to its fleet across the state. Of which, 250 electric buses are mentioned as 'awaiting' for Pune. "The plan has been bifurcated based on Maharashtra's regions; thus LNG and CNG buses will be provided to Nagpur and coastal regions like Konkan where pipelines are available. However, regions like Marathwada and Pune will receive electric buses, as CNG rates are high in these areas," he said. "We are waiting for 250 electric buses to be deployed in Pune, which, according to higher authorities, are expected to arrive by March 2025," Nehul added. Nehul also informed that currently, 824 MSRTC buses are operating in Pune, consisting of 200 CNG buses, 64 electric buses, 450 Ordinary High-Speed Diesel (ORD HSD) buses, and 110 AC High-Speed Diesel (AC HSD) buses. According to an official resolution dated August 26, 2024, provided by MSRTC official Abhijeet Bhosle of Mumbai division, the proposal was finalised last year following a high-level meeting on September 22, where the plan to convert diesel buses to LNG was discussed in detail. The official document stated that a total of 5,000 LNG buses would be inducted, with each bus costing Rs 19.4 lakh, totalling Rs 970 crore. As per MSRTC, the transport corporation currently has a total of 15,000 buses in its fleet, with 60,000 commuters travel-

Delhi court grants bail to alleged mastermind of Rs 91 lakh cyber fraud

cyber fraudAdvocate Pravesh Dabas, representing the accused, argued before the court that the investigation relating to Dinesh had already been completed and no purpose would be served by keeping him in judicial custody. The alleged mastermind of the nearly Rs 91 lakh cyber fraud, who was among eight people arrested in July by the Delhi Police, was recently granted bail by a court. According to the Delhi Police, Dinesh was among those who defrauded a man named Sachin Bansal of Rs 90 lakh through a WhatsApp group called "Thakor Academy of Financial Institution". Bansal, who joined the group on January 17, was given "stock market investment tips" by the members of the group. He was also asked to open a cryptocurrency account on the website http:// www.yotemog.com under the pretext of high trading returns. From April 2 to June 16, Bansal transferred nearly Rs 90 lakh to 19 different accounts provided to him by the members of the group. Bansal later realised he had been defrauded, after which the alleged accounts were frozen. While granting Dinesh bail last Friday, Chief Judicial Magistrate Nabeela Wali of Patiala House Court said, ..recovery of incriminating material has already been affected from the applicant/ accused and mobile phone of applicant/ accused has been seized and the IO has not produced anything before the Court to show the basic information and material for arresting the accused". Advocate Pravesh Dabas, representing the accused, argued before the court that the investigation relating to Dinesh had already been completed and no purpose would be served by keeping him in judicial cus-



tody. He also claimed Dinesh had no relation to the crime and was falsely implicated based on statements given by the co-accused. On the other hand, the prosecution strongly opposed his bail plea stating that he was the "shrewd" mastermind in this case and that if released on bail, he may help his associates escape and destroy evi-

During the probe, all the suspected accounts were frozen at the direction of the police. One of the accounts registered in the name of Gaurav Trading had a balance of Rs 46 lakh in it. Ajay and Mohit — the accused in the case - allegedly visited the bank where this account was opened to de-freeze it using a "forged" notice. Structural consultant named in FIR in Shivaji statue collapse held from Kolhapur

Chetan Patil, the structural consultant named in the FIR registered in connection with the collapse of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's statue in Maharashtra's Sindhudurg district, has been arrested from Kolhapur, police said on Friday. Patil was taken into custody late on Thursday night and was handed over to the Sindhudurg police for further investigation, said Kolhapur Superintendent of Police Mahendra Pandit. According to the Sindhudurg police, Patil has been arrested in the case.

Patil, a resident of Kolhapur, had claimed on Wednesday that he was not the structural consultant for the project. Speaking to the Marathi news channel ABP Majha, Patil, named in the FIR along with artist Jaydeep Apte, had said that he had submitted the design of the platform to the Indian Navy through the state's Public Works Department (PWD) but had nothing to do with the statue itself."A Thane-based company did the statue-related work. I was just asked to work on the platform on which the statue was being erected," Patil had said. The 35-foot statue of the 17th-century Maratha warrior king, unveiled by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at Rajkot fort in Malvan tehsil of Sindhudurg on Navy Day (December 4) last year, collapsed around 1 pm on Monday. The incident caused embarrassment to the Chief Minister Eknath Shinde-led state government and invited criticism and protests from the opposition parties. Shinde said the statue was designed and constructed by the Indian Navy.

The petitioner had noted that while Bajwa's bail had been cancelled by the high court on October 20, 2023, no action to arrest him had been taken so far. During the resumed hearing, the HC had inquired about Bajwa's whereabouts from his counsel, Senior Advocate PS Hundal, who had stated that the Supreme Court had stayed Bajwa's arrest, so his personal appearance beforethe court was not required. Hundal had requested 15 days for Bajwa to appear before the court. However, the court had found this excuse vague and lacking a solid basis, noting that Bajwa had been a habitual offender

During the proceedings, it had been revealed that Bajwa had been monitoring the court proceedings via video conferencing. Upon questioning, Bajwa had pleaded guilty, claiming he had not intentionally evaded court directions but had been occupied with managing his affairs and arranging funds to settle disputes. He had assured the court he would appear in person when directed. The DGP of Punjab, Gaurav Yadav, had assured the HC that steps would be taken to conclude the pending investigations against Bajwa in a time-bound manner. The HC had also noted that Bajwa had been declared a proclaimed person by the Judicial Magistrate First Class, Kharar, on July 4, 2022, in a 2017 complaint case pending before the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Mohali. Despite this, Bajwa had not participated in the trial pro-

The court had criticized Bajwa's conduct, pointing out that he had been involved in 53 FIRs, which had reflected his disregard for the law. However, based on assurances from the Advocate General of Punjab and the DGP, the HC had directed the state to file a comprehensive response within a specified timeframe to ensure all pending investigations had been concluded.

Ex-MP makes derogatory remarks against Kangana, she says: 'country will never stop trivialising rape'

KanganaMann made the remarks while replying to reporters in Karnal who sought his comments Ranaut's controversial statements. Shiromani Akali Dal (Amritsar) chief and former MP Simranjit Singh Mann Thursday sparked a row by making derogatory remarks against Kangana Ranaut while mentioning "rape", triggering a sharp reaction from the BJP MP who accused the Punjab politician of trivialising the crime against women. Mann made the remarks while replying to reporters in Karnal who sought his comments Ranaut's controversial statements where she alleged that bodies were hanging and rapes taking place during the farmers' protest against the now-repealed farm laws. The Mandi MP, in an interview, had also suggested that a "Bangladesh-like situation" could have erupted in India and that China and the US were involved in the "conspiracy".

The BJP had quickly distanced itself from Ranaut's comments and made it clear that she is neither permitted nor authorised to comment on the party's policy matters. Sharing a video clip of Mann's interaction with

reporters on X, Ranaut said, "It seems this country will never stop trivialising rape". "No wonder rapes and violence against women....is so deep rooted in the psyche of this patriarchal nation that it is casually used to tease or mock a woman even if she is a high profile filmmaker or politician," she saidMann's grandson Govind Singh Sandhu, who is also SAD(A) organisational secretary and handled the senior politician's campaign in this year's Lok sabha polls, declined to comment saying he has "not seen the statement yet". Haryana State Commission for Women chairperson Renu Bhatia said Mann's comments were an "insult to our daughters". Raj Lali Gill, chairperson of the Punjab State Women Commission, commented that what Ranaut said on farmers' protest is "shameful" but Mann's reaction is "even more shameful". "It is shocking the way the senior leader has spoken about a woman. How can he say this? I will initiate action against him," Gill said, adding she will issue a notice after going through the provisions of the law. As the row escalated, Mann, a proponent of Khalistan, in a post on X, said, "My party and I always stand for the security and safety of women". He, however, again trained guns at Ranaut and accused her of leveling false accusations against farmers. "Räpe is a heinous crime...MP from Mandi....seems to derive some form of thrill by spreading misinformation against the Sikhs, farmers and farm labourers. Her concern on crime against women is something she must question her own ruling party about. Equality and safety of our women is totally compromised in India today," Mann added.In another post, he raised 1984 riots in Delhi and said, "For 40 years we have had no justice for the crimes committed against Sikh women in Trilokpuri," he said and added that Ranaut doesn't find fault "with the State, but only with Sikhs and farmers". This showed her "deeprooted hate for a particular community", he alleged. Mann, 79, had resigned from the IPS in 1984 following Operation Bluestar at Amritsar's Golden Temple to flush out militants hiding in the complex. He was elected to the Lok Sabha from Tarn Taran in 1989, Sangrur in 1999 and from the same constituency again in a 2022 bypoll.

Former IAS trainee Puja Khedkar says UPSC can't cancel her candidature

In a rejoinder filed by former IAS trainee officer Puja Khedkar in her plea seeking anticipatory bail before the Delhi High Court, Khedkar has submitted that after her selection and appointment as a probationer, UPSC "ceases the power to disqualify her candidature and DoPT (Department of Personnel and Training) alone can take action under the All India Services Act 1954."

Mental Health Crisis: Sassoon Hospital appeals for urgent solution as 'abandoned' patient awaits rehabilitation

mental health, sassoon general hospital, In their letter to the Mental Health Review Board on August 27, Dr Yellappa Jadhav, medical superintendent, B J Medical College and Sassoon General Hospital and Dr Dr Niteen Abhivant, Head of the Department, Psychiatry, B J Medical College and Sassoon General Hospital have urged the board to issue written instructions in the case.

Sassoon General hospital, Maharashtra's largest government-run tertiary care facility in Pune, faces a piquant situation. The surgery department treated a 40year-old woman who had been injured in a road accident. While she recovered, the doctors also diagnosed her with psychosis and recommended long-term rehabilitation. However, with no caregiver and apparently abandoned, the woman has remained a patient at the hospital for over five months now. The authorities have appealed to the District Mental Health Review Board to arrange appropriate rehabilitation measures at the Regional Mental Hospital, Yerawada and sent several letters including attending meetings on the issue. As per the Mental Health Act 2017, in case there is no caregiver or relative of such persons, then the Director, Department of Social Welfare is the nominated representative to take mental health care and treatment decisions. In their letter to the Mental Health Review Board on August 27, Dr Yellappa Jadhav, medical superintendent, B J Medical College and Sassoon General Hospital and Dr Niteen Abhivant, Head of the Department, Psychiatry, B J Medical College and Sassoon General Hospital have urged the board to issue written instructions in the case. When contacted, Dr Abhivant said that the woman whose right arm was injured allegedly in a road accident was brought to the Emergency room in state-run 10 ambulance service. "Doctors at the surgery department treated the patient, but noticed that the woman had irrelevant talk and irritability. She was referred to the psychiatry department where the diagnosis indicated psychosis. She is presently on medications but needs long term rehabilitation," Dr Abhivant said. A meeting was held on July 30 and on August 28 with the Mental Health Review Boardwhich is a quasi-judicial body. MHRB authorities said the social welfare department director is the nominated representative. Dr Sunil Patil, member secretary of the board, said that the effort is to rehabilitate mentally ill patients.Dr Patil, who is the medical superintendent at Regional Mental Hospital, Yerawada, said there are at least four-

five rehabilitation centres in Pune. Several patients from

regional mental hospital who have no families are cured

and fit to be discharged as part of special efforts. "We are



looking into this matter," he said.

When contacted, Pravin Korgantiwar, District Social Welfare Officer said he was not aware of the matter.At any given time, Sassoon General Hospital has at least 50 persons who are listed in the 'unknown' category and occupy in-patient beds for a long period of time. "There are several patients in the orthopaedic section, other wards while the current patient with psychosis is in the psychiatry ward," Dr Jadhav said. "Sassoon General Hospital is a tertiary care facility and not a centre to rehabilitate destitute persons," Dr Jadhav said. In 'pashuan da aahar', Punjab finds fodder for an ever-growing industry

The silage-making industry in Punjab is gradually evolving into a more organised and essential sector. What was once a practice confined to large dairy farms has now permeated even small-scale operations, driven by the rising demand for consistent and nutritious fodder.Silage, locally called 'Pashuan da Aahar' (food of the cattle), is the process of fermenting and storing green fodder for cattle. With the advent of bale silage, the practice has become more accessible and economically viable for dairy farmers. However, experts caution that silage-making and feeding require careful attention to avoid potential risks. Punjab has witnessed a significant increase in silage-making units over the past few years. Dr Harinder Singh Khanna, a pioneer in the field, established India's first commercial fodder processing company, Excellent Enterprises Private Limited, in Ludhiana in 1992. His company has since helped several others set up their silage-making units.Dr Khanna's company produced around 25,000 tonne of silage this year, supplying several states across the country. He said that there are currently 220 silage-making plants/companies/units for commercial purposes in Punjab

fodder Dr Harinder Singh Khanna, established India's first commercial fodder processing company, Excellent Enterprises Private Limited, in Ludhiana in 1992. This growth has been fueled by the efforts of entrepreneurs who recognised the potential of silage as a business opportunity. Demand from neighbouring states is also high, with 27-30% of the silage transported to Jammu & Kashmir, 22-25% to Rajasthan, 12-15% to Uttarakhand, 15-18% to Himachal Pradesh, and 10% to Gujarat from Punjab.In 2022-23, the production of commercial bale silage reached 3.5 lakh tonne, with a market value of around Rs 210 crore — a significant leap from just 0.05 lakh tonne in 2015. This year, however, prolonged heat waves in May and June affected silage production, leading to a significant decrease in the amount prepared for commercial purposes compared to the previous year.In Punjab, pit/bunker silage is prevalent, traditionally made by dairy farmers for their own cattle. In 2022-23, pit/bunker silage production amounted to around 35 lakh tonne. This method involves preparing silage in pits that are 5-6 feet deep, 15-16 feet long, and 8 feet wide.Samrala-based Lakhbir Singh Gill of GN Food and Fodder said that their firm produced 7,000 quintals of silage this year and the demand is very high. He added that the potential for silage in the state is vast, and his firm

Gagandeep Singh, who has been running a dairy farm with 800 Holstein Friesian (HF) cows for the past 15 years, recently opened a commercial silage plant in Sangrur. He has been making silage for his farm in pits and bunkers but since 2019, he has also started producing silage for commercial purposes. (Express photo/Representational image)Gagandeep has entered into buyback agreements with several farmers to grow maize for his silage unit, providing them with an assured market and reducing their reliance on paddy cultivation. "Silage is highly nutritious and digestible if the quality is maintained," Gagandeep said, adding, "At our farm, we have all HF cows, and an adult HF cow requires around 30 kg of silage daily, along with 1-2 kg of dry fodder and 12 kg of feed made from wheat, mustard, cottonseed, soya, etc." In Punjab, maize is considered the best crop for making silage. When maize is 90-95 days old, or at the milky stage, it is harvested, chopped, and packed into bales wrapped in plastic sheets to eliminate air. These bales are ready for feeding cattle after about 45 days. Companies produce bales ranging from 60-70 kg to five quintals, which can be stored longterm but must be consumed quickly once opened to maintain quality. Pit/bunker silage is prepared by pressing the chopped fodder in pits, covering it with plastic sheets, and sealing it with wet earth to prevent air exposure. This method is economical, with farmers receiving Rs 5 to 6 per kg of silage. And they are not required to procure green fodder daily as it is difficult to maintain the quality of green fodder. Farmers growing maize for silage can get between Rs 40,000 to Rs 58,000 per acre, depending on the yield. After accounting for input costs, they can get Rs 25,000 to Rs 40,000 per acre. However, despite its potential, the industry requires caution. Experts said that 80% silage is prepared from spring maize, which requires significant water during the hot summer months, putting pressure on groundwater resources. Spring maize, sown in February or March, often requires a 15-19 irrigation cycle. In contrast, Kharif maize, sown during the rainy season, requires less water and can yield about 18 tonne per acre. Also if Kharif maize is promoted for silage making then it will lead to diversification because Kharif maize is the best alternative for water guzzling paddy. Even farmers can take one crop such as peas and early table potato after harvesting maize for silage in early September and sow wheat in November. Experts of Directorate of Extension Education Guru Angad Dev Veterinary and Animal Science University (GADVASU) in a panel discussion about silage recently highlighted that proper silage-making techniques are crucial to prevent the growth of harmful molds and fungi, which can pose serious health risks to cattle and humans. Harvesting maize at the correct stage, maintaining appropriate moisture levels, and storing silage in airtight conditions are essential steps. Regular lab testing is necessary to ensure silage quality and prevent contamination, which could have severe consequences for both animals and humans.GADVASU experts advised farmers to open silage pits after 40 or 45 days from one side, ensuring minimal contact with air. When taking out silage daily, farmers should cover it properly to maintain quality. The exposed layer of silage should be cut up to 6 inches deep, and only fresh silage beneath this layer should be fed to cattle daily from the bunker. Additionally, the disposal of plastic sheets used in silage bales needs careful consideration to avoid environmental issues. By following these guidelines, the silage industry can continue to grow as a sustainable and beneficial practice in Punjab. However, vigilance is required to ensure that it remains a boon rather than a

A sports village belonging to the brother of a former Congress Union minister, several structures built by a leading industrialist, and constructions by leaders across the political spectrum. These are among several "illegal" buildings that have been demolished by the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Monitoring and Protection Agency - known popularly as Hydra - in the two months of the body's existence. Set up in July by the ruling Congress government to replace the Enforcement, Vigilance and Disaster Management wing of the government, Hydra is mandated to tackle illegal encroachment on water bodies in the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation limits and surrounding areas. Since its formation, the body has been on a demolition spree, tearing down structures belonging not only to rival parties like the BRS, the BJP and the AIMIM, but also some Congress leaders such as Pallam Anand, brother of former Union Minister MM Pallam Raju. According to officials, from June 27 to August 24, Hydra razed 166 illegal structures and recov-

ered 44 acres of encroached lake land. For instance, on August 18, two buildings and several other structures at Anand's luxury sports village Oro and several permanent and temporary structures belonging to industrialist G V Bhasker Rao, chairman and MD of Kaveri Seeds Co Ltd and ex-member of Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams, were demolished on the grounds that they were built on the fragile full tank level (FTL) area and buffer zone of Gandipet lake. While the FTL is the highest level that water in a water body can reach, a buffer zone is the protected area around this that's kept clear of any development. Properties belonging to the BJP's executive committee member C Sunil Reddy, who unsuccessfully contested last year's Telangana assembly election from Manthani, were also demolished around Gandipet lake.Bulldozers also brought down four structures belonging to AIMIM Bahadurpura MLA Mohammed Mubeen, five other constructions belonging to AIMIM MLC Mirza Rahmat Baig, and at least 16 temporary sheds that supporters of Khairatabad Congress MLA Danam Nagender had allegedly built in a public park at Nandagiri Hills locality of Jubilee Hills. Besides these, authorities also took down 54 temporary structures that BRS leader Ratnakaram Sai Raju had allegedly built in the FTL and buffer zones of Chintal Lake in Gajularamaram village. According to authorities, this freed up 3.5 acres of lake land. The exercise isn't limited to Hyderabad alone. According to sources, BRS leader and Jangaon MLA Palla Rajeshwar Reddy has received a notice following a police complaint from the state's irrigation department that some educational institutions he runs have encroached on Nadam lake in Medchal-Malkajgiri district. Meanwhile, a farmhouse taken on lease by BRS working president and former minister KT Rama Rao in the catchment area of Himayat Sagar and Osman Sagar in Ranga Reddy

officials claim that while in some cases, the alleged encroachers built permanent facilities such as restaurants and amusement facilities, others erected temporary structures for personal use. On its part, the government claims that the drive is only aimed at clearing encroachments in FTL areas and buffer zones around Hyderabad's lakes."There is no partiality or targeting in this exercise. Whoever has encroached will face the long arm of Hydra," Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka told But the Opposition claims that leaders are being selectively targeted. In a post on X last week, BRS spokesperson Manne Krishank alleged that buildings that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's brother Anumula Tirupathi Reddy owns in Hyderabad's Durgam Cheruvu also stands in the FTL zone. "Congress MLA Vivek Venkatswamy and Revenue minister Ponguleti Sreenivas Reddy own farmhouses near lakes, will they be demolished too?" his post asked. With questions being raised, the Revanth Reddy government on Wednesday and Thursday issued notices to the CM's brother, A Tirupathi Reddy, over properties he owns near the Durgam Cheruvu lake in Madhapur in Cyberabad area. The demolition notices were issued by Revenue department officers to several property owners, including Tirupathi Reddy's residence and offices located in the Madhapur Amar Cooperative Society. The notices stated that the structures must be removed within a month. At least six other residential societies and commercial areas abutting the lake have been issued notices. The notices were issued under the Telangana Water, Land and Trees Act. The CM's brother, in a statement, said that when he had purchased the properties in 2015, he was unaware that it was on protected lake land. "If the government finds that my properties are in the FTL, I have no objection to authorities demolishing them. I will cooperate," he said. Meanwhile, AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi, whose Fatima Owaisi College at Bandlaguda too has come under fire for alleged violations, has claimed that government buildings such as GHMC's headquarters also stand in the FTL zone. "Would the government demolish these too?" he asked last week. Opp sharpens attack on CM Mamata: 'Her tricks have been caught this time'

The Opposition parties on Thursday sharpened their attack on the TMC government in the state, especially Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, over the handling of the rape and murder of a junior doctor at Kolkata's RG Kar Hospital earlier this month. Senior Congress leader Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, who led a protest march in the heart of Kolkata dressed in black clothes, accused the chief minister of "playing tricks". "Mamata Banerjee is playing tricks. But her tricks have been caught. She wants to hold the CBI responsible for everything. When the Calcutta High Court ordered a CBI probe, she could have filed an affidavit seeking 10 more days for Kolkata Police to crack the case," Chowdhury, who lost the Lok Sabha elections,

Chowdhury, who marched from College Square to Shyambazar, with hundreds of party supporters called it a people's movement. "I will not say people should fight for justice holding a political flag. They can fight without any political identity. We are with them. It is a people's movement," he said.CPI(M) leader Srijan Bhattacharya, who took part in another protest march from College Street from Esplanade, seeking justice for the doctor, said: "Every time, the chief minister was able to manage the rape cases alleging conspiracy or casting doubt on the victim or other things. This time her every possible trick and process for tampering evidence flopped. She is trying to change the direction of the movement by politicising it. Now, she is saying she will bring a law against rape. This is again a bluff. People of Bengal will understand this."

The CPI(M) leader was referring to the CM's speech on Wednesday where she said her government would bring a law in the state to ensure capital punishment in rape cases. The Left Front, meanwhile, has announced to hold a "mega protest march" on September 3. The Left Front has asked other parties, including the Congress, to join their march. The BJP, which had called a 12-hour bandh on Wednesday over the police action of protesters during Nabanna Abhijan, held a sit-in demonstration near Esplanade on Thursday. A delegation of BJP leaders, led by state BJP chief Sukanta Majumdar, also met Governor C V Ananda Bose in Raj Bhavan and urged him to take a "decisive action to address the turmoil" in the state. "We requested the Governor to protect the rights of people in Bengal and take whatever measures are necessary to lift the state out of this dire situation, Majumdar told mediapersons after coming out of Raj Bhavan. He was accompanied by senior party leader



Dilip Ghosh. Accusing CM Mamata Banerjee of inciting unrest through her statements, Majumdar said: "We have provided the Governor with detailed information about the situation, which has deteriorated since the (rapemurder) incident on August 9. We urge the Governor, as the custodian of the Constitution, to address these issues."Several BJP leaders, including Leader of the Opposition Suvendu Adhikari, have called for Banerjee's resignation, accusing her of failing to prevent the rapemurder of the doctor, and for allegedly attempting to coverup evidence and protect some of the perpetrators. They also suggested the imposition of Article 356, which allows for central intervention in states under certain circumstances. Following their meeting with the Governor, Majumdar and other BJP leaders participated in a sit-in protest, demanding the CM's resignation.

In response to the BJP team's visit to Raj Bhavan, TMC leader Kunal Ghosh told reporters, "We had been asking for the removal of the Governor, who is himself facing charges of sexual misconduct by a former Raj Bhavan staffer." "Instead of making the demand to remove a democratically elected government, BJP leaders should explain why this Governor cannot be removed despite serious complaints against him," Ghosh said. Regarding the emergence of an audio recording purportedly related to the RG Kar hospital case, Ghosh commented, "We cannot confirm the authenticity of this recording. It should be examined by the CBI and become part of the investigation. We continue to call for all perpetrators to be held accountable, for the victim's family and friends to receive justice, and for the truth to be uncovered."The woman postgraduate trainee doctor was found raped and murdered in the hospital on August 9, which triggered a spate of protests across the city and the state for the past 21 days.

After Sanjay Roy's arrest in Kolkata doctor's rape and murder case, a question: Who are civic volunteers and why police bank on them?

The arrest of Sanjay Roy, a civic volunteer attached to Kolkata Police, for the rape and murder of a 31-vearold trainee doctor at RG Kar Hospital has once again put focus on the group of Class VIII pass men hired to assist traffic police and do odd ancillary jobs for the cops. This is not the first time a civic volunteer has hit the headlines for all the wrong reasons. Two years ago, a civic volunteer was arrested for the murder of student leader Anis Khan in Amta, Howrah. A year later, another civic volunteer made news for allegedly abducting a businessman in Bhangar.Mandated only with the task of managing traffic and assisting police during festivals and awareness campaigns, the civic volunteers are allegedly used to collect bribes, assist in arrests, and even control law and order situations. A year after the Trinamool Congress (TMC) came to power in West Bengal, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee launched the civic police and village police forces in 2012 to "assist police". At present, there are about 1.17 Lakh civic volunteers in the state. According to the state Home Department, the first criterion for recruiting a civic police volunteer is that the applicant should be a resident of the area where they will be deployed. The age band of the applicant is 20-30 years old and the minimum educational qualification is Class VIII pass. Generally, preference is given to the applicants who have done well in sports and have experience as NCC cadet/ Boy Scouts/ NSS guide/ Civil Defence Volunteers etc. or possess technical skills such as driving, technician, computer skills etc. They should not have any criminal records and be physically and mentally fit.

The salary of a civic police volunteer is Rs 10,000 per month with additional benefits of Rs 5 lakh medical insurance and Rs 6,000 Puja bonus. On retirement, they are entitled to get Rs 5 lakh one-time benefit."On paper, there is a provision for the background check of the applicants before they are recruited. But since the civic volunteers are locals, word of mouth is also generally accepted," said a senior police officer."After recruitment, they get a training of 10 days. Thereafter, they are supposed to get regular refresher training. This, however, seldom takes place," added the officer. In March, 2023, the Calcutta High Court ordered West Bengal Police that civic volunteers can't be engaged in any law-and-order duties. Following

the High Court's order, the government issued a guide-

line for civic volunteers. According to the state Home Department, civic volunteers should only assist police in traffic management, major festivals, dealing with unauthorized parking vehicles and ensuring public safety. They cannot be engaged in any investigative work or law and order-related subjects of the police force. Stop-gap arrangementSources in the police administration said that despite the guidelines, civic volunteers play a crucial and more elaborate role covering most aspects of policing since there is a dearth of constables. The West Bengal Police is understaffed with less than 100 police staff for 1 lakh population. Bihar and West Bengal have the lowest ratio of police personnel to per lakh population in the country at 75.16 and 97.66, respectively, according to a reply by Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai in Lok Sabha last year. The sanctioned strength of West Bengal police-population ratio is 160.76 per lakh population.In contrast, as on January 1, 2022, the number of police personnel per lakh persons in the country is 196.23 as per sanctioned strength and 152.80 as per actual strength. "The system of civic police is a stop-gap system. How can it make up for the loss in policemen retiring or the need to fill in vacancies? There is no proper recruitment system or fair drill for the civic police. They are mostly recruited from recommendations of ruling party leaders. The Calcutta High Court and later the Election Commission barred them from law-and-order duties and election duties. Their role in policing or assisting the police is already being questioned," said former Inspector General (Intelligence Branch) Pankaj Dutta. "There is also no legal obligation on the part of the civic volunteers in case they make a mistake. A constable on the other hand faces stringent scrutiny and punishment for any mistake," added Dutta. Echoing him, an officer in charge of a police station in North Kolkata said: "In every police station, there is a dearth of constables. We need to have constables put in armoury, sentry duties, lock-up duties where no one else can be assigned. This further reduces the numbers we need. If there are multiple law and order situations in an area, we are forced to send civic volunteers. We are helpless. But if anything the civic volunteer does, we are blamed."Former Director General of Police Bhupinder Singh said: "I am not in favour of such a force. Anybody, who is in the police force or assisting the police, all must be properly trained. Discipline has to be

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath alleged on Thursday that the misdeeds of the Samajwadi Party were well known and that hooliganism, anarchy, violating women and endangering the safety of traders were its only hallmarks when the party was in power in Uttar Pradesh. "Samajwadi Party ki topi laal, lekin kaarname kaale hain (SP leaders wear red caps but commit evil deeds). Their public image is a facade, hiding their true nature. It is because of them that the people of Sisamau are now facing by-election," the CM said addressing a public meeting at a government college in the Sisamau Assembly constituency of Kanpur district which is scheduled to go to the bypolls soon. The seat fell vacant after SP MLA Irfan Solanki was disqualified from the Assembly following his conviction in a criminal case. In Ayodhya, an SP leader raped a 'Nishad daughter,' but instead of addressing the issue, their party chief (Akhilesh Yadav) shamelessly supported the perpetrator, the CM alleged. Another model of the SP was evident in Kannauj, the CM pointed out. "They violate daughters using their ill-gotten property. Nawab brand is their real identity. This accused is also linked with the SP. A look at their history reveals it is filled with evil deeds,"

The Chief Minister, who inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for development projects worth Rs 750 crore, also distributed appointment letters to over a thousand youths and tablets and smartphones to 8,087 students. He also disbursed loans totalling Rs 191 crore to 5,027 beneficiaries. He thanked people for electing Ramesh Awasthi from Kanpur and Devendra Singh 'Bhole' from Akbarpur in the recently concluded Lok Sabha elections. "The SP members grab the properties of the poor and incite riots. On the day when the former president (Ram Nath Kovind), a son of this soil, visited Kanpur, the SP MLA from Sisamau (Irfan Solanki) was plotting to ignite riots in Sisamau and Kanpur. Now, he is facing the consequences for his actions. The public had given them a five-year mandate, but they are now facing by-elections. The SP never misses an opportunity to foment anarchy," Adityanath added.

The "double-engine" government in UP has established a model of security, good governance, and development, the CM claimed, urging people to look forward to a bright future with renewed aspirations. "Before 2017, UP was struggling with an identity crisis. Riots were common during festivals, and both daughters and traders were unsafe. The state was unattractive to investors, and youth were leaving in search of better opportunities. In response to PM Modi's call, the public elected the BJP in 2017. Over the past seven-and-a-half years, the state has made significant progress. Today, UP sets the standard for development, good governance, and law and order," he added. The CM noted that the firm Lal Imli, which once was a symbol of Kanpur, was shut down due to Congress' corruption. "A company, which should have provided jobs and employment for the youth, supporting the livelihoods of thousands of families, stands today as a monument of Congress' corruption, Our government is committed to revitalizing Lal Imli with a significant revival package. We have expanded efforts to include the revival of the entire land and sick units as part of this initiative," he said. Claiming that 6.5 lakh youth secured government jobs in the past-seven-and-a-half years without recommendations or bribes, Yogi said, "Our government jails those who jeopardise the future of our youth. We are impounding their illegal properties and redistributing it among the poor. The youth need employment."

"In November 2017, I emphasised the need for industrial investment. Initially, our target was Rs 20,000 crore, but thanks to the robust law and order situation, the UP Global Investors Summit has attracted investment proposals worth Rs 40 lakh crore," he added. Announcing that 2 lakh youth will be provided government jobs within two years, he said the recruitment process for over 60,200 police vacancies is underway. "Those who attempt to disrupt this process will face life imprisonment, a fine of Rs 1 crore, and confiscation of property. Within two years, 1 lakh youths will be recruited into the UP Police, with 20% of these positions reserved for women, ensuring that daughters can combat the hooliganism of those associated with the SP on the streets.

Over 1 crore youth will be provided jobs through various investment proposals, he said, adding that 50 lakh youth will be linked to self-employment schemes such as the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Swarojgar Yojana, Mukhyamantri Yuva Swarojgar Yojana, ODOP, PM SVANidhi, PM Vishwakarma, and Mukhyamantri Vishwakarma Shram Samman Yojana. The CM said a senior minister in the government has been tasked with overseeing Kanpur's development and the city is moving towards resolving its traffic congestion problem. Earlier, sewage from Sisamau was discharged into the Ganga, but now Kanpur is becoming integral to maintaining the Ganga's uninterrupted flow, he said. "While the Green Field Express between Lucknow and Kanpur is expected to boost development, the Ganga Expressway will link Meerut to Prayagraj via Kanpur and Lucknow. The Defense Manufacturing Corridor is poised to become a cornerstone of this development," Adityanath said.

Kamala Harris fires back over failed border czar jab: 'Trump killed border bill'

US Vice President Kamala Harris on Thursday strongly rebuked former President Donald Trump's recent attacks on her handling of border security, accusing him of undermining a bipartisan effort to strengthen the US-Mexico border.In her first major interview since becoming the Democratic presidential nominee, Harris blamed Trump for the very border security issues he has frequently castigated. This comes after a Trump campaign attack ad linked Harris to the issue of illegal immigration and crime stemming from it."Donald Trump got word of this bill that would've contributed to securing our border," Harris told CNN. "And because he believes that it would not have helped him politically, he told his folks in Congress, 'Don't put it forward.' He killed the bill: a border security bill that would've put 1,500 more agents on the

In recent weeks, Trump and the Republican Party

have relentlessly attacked Harris about the border. "If border czar Harris stays in charge, every week will bring a never-ending stream of illegal alien rapists, bloodthirsty killers, and child predators to go after our sons and our daughters," Trump said at a rally in North Carolina. Harris fired back, pointing out that the border bill Trump opposed would have bolstered efforts to stop fentanyl, a highly addictive opiod, from entering the US. Harris pledged that if elected, she would revive the bill, which she argued could have made a significant impact on border security."Not only [would I] push it, I would make sure that it would come to my desk and I would sign it," she said. Harris also clarified her stance on border security, stating that she does not support decriminalising illegally crossing the border into the US."I believe there should be consequences," she stated. "We have laws that have to be followed and enforced that address and deal with people who cross our border illegally. And there should be consequence."At the Democratic National Convention, Harris backed the construction of a wall along the United States' southern border, a project she once opposed and called "un-American" during the Trump administration. When asked how voters should view her policy shift, the Vice President was firm: "My value around what we need to do to secure our border, that value has not changed."The Democrat also highlighted her experience in dealing with border issues. "Let's be clear, in this race, I'm the only person who has prosecuted transnational criminal organisations who traffic in guns, drugs, and human beings," she said. "I'm the only person in this race who actually served a border state as attorney general to enforce our laws. And I would enforce our laws as President going forward," Harris asserted.

My grammar's not always correct: Tim Walz admits he misspoke about being in war

Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, the running mate of Kamala Harris for the US presidential election, admitted that he misspoke about participating in a war. Walz clarified his claims, including an old video in which he claimed to have carried weapons in war, stating his grammar is not always correct. However, he defended his career in the Army National Guard during an interview with CNN on Thursday (US local time), saying, "the record speaks for itself," as he sought to dismiss Republican charges against him regarding his military service. Walz could be heard saying in a 2018 video clip that the Harris-Walz campaign previously circulated, "We can make sure that those weapons of war that I carried in war are the only place where those weapons are at." Although Walz served 24 years in the Army National Guard, he was never in a combat zone. When CNN's Dana Bash's specifically asked whether he misspoke about his participation in the war, Walz said, "My wife, the English teacher, told me my grammar's not always correct". Further, in the interview along with Kamala Harris, where Walz remained largely silent, he said he was "incredibly proud" of his National Guard service. "My record speaks for itself, but I think people are coming to get to know me. I speak like they do. I speak candidly, I wear my emotions on my sleeves, and I speak especially passionately about our children being shot in schools ... I think people know me. They



know who I am. They know where my heart is," the Minnesota Governor said. He stressed, "One thing I'll never do is, I'll never demean another member's service in any way. I never have. And I never will"

The Harris campaign also recently acknowledged that Walz "misspoke" during a 2018 campaign event when he said he handled assault weapons "in war". Donald Trump's campaign has been targeting Walz, questioning his service in the Army.

Earlier this month, Trump's running mate, JD Vance, accused Walz of evading deployment to Iraq by retiring from the Army National Guard to run for Congress in 2005. Vance, who served in the Marine Corps, accused Walz of

X suspends 'Barry Stanton' account after Indians outrage over racist posts

The action came after Barry Stanton's posts were flagged by hundreds of irate Indians, with several calling out Elon Musk for not suspending the account. The X handle of an anonymous social media user, Barry Stanton (@barrystantonGBP), who went viral for his racist posts and rants in which he criticised Indians and Indian immigrants, was suspended on Friday. The action came after Stanton's posts were flagged by hundreds of irate Indians, with several even calling out X owner Elon Musk for not suspending the account.

The suspension of the account became a subject of intense debate and memes on X. The hashtag "suspended" was among the top trends on X on Friday morning. Stanton, who has a verified handle with over 1.8 lakh followers, has shared several cartoons and memes depicting Indians defecating in the open. He also praised

a post on X on how to drive Indians away from "white neighbourhoods". Several hateful and abusive posts against Jews and Africans have also been tweeted from the handle. "Why do black people think comedy is just loud people shouting?" one of his posts said. An X user, Akshit Singh, tweeted that he had flagged the Barry Stanton account to Minister of Information and Broadcasting Ashwini Vaishnaw and the UK High Commission in India. He sought an investigation into the activities of the 'Barry Stanton' X account. "This account has been engaging in the propagation of hate speech and offensive remarks that target individuals based on race and nationality," he said in his complaint. Another user commented, "Musk has opened the gates of hell. It's been proven, in fact, that the current Twitter algorithm is pushing racist tweets up against Indians."

WHO IS BARRY STANTON? Barry Stanton's bio on X claims that he is a British national and a father of five. According to a report by a UK website, the pictures on Stanton's account are not his, but of another man, a pensioner from Worcestershire. Surprisingly, the X handle has been posting hateful content over several years, which has been garnering thousands of retweets and likes. One of his posts on X that was retweeted over 4,000 times said, "Just picked my lad up from school. He tells me he was forced to read the korma in religion class.""Barry Stanton does not exist -- or, not in the way Twitter users want to think he does. The account is a parody, created either by a liberal mocking the racists they detest or a real racist spreading their views via humour while hiding behind another person's face," the report said.

US reports over 50 illnesses, 8 deaths in Listeria outbreak

Los Angeles: The US has reported more than 50 illnesses and eight deaths in Listeria outbreak, according to the latest data released by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).Listeria is a hardy germ that can remain on surfaces, like meat slicers, and foods, even at refrigerated temperatures, Xinhua news agency reported on Wednesday. It can also take up to 10 weeks for some people to have symptoms of listeriosis, according to CDC.

Epidemiologic, laboratory, and traceback data show that meats sliced at delis, including Boar's Head brand liverwurst, are contaminated with Listeria and are making people sick, according to CDC.Listeria spreads easily among deli equipment, surfaces, hands, and food.A total of 57 people have been hospitalised due to Listeria

infections in the country, and eight deaths have now been reported, according to CDC. This is the largest listeriosis outbreak since the 2011 outbreak linked to cantaloupe. The CDC requested the public not to eat recalled deli products. People who are at higher risk of getting sick with Listeria, such as those who are pregnant, are aged 65 or older, or have a weakened immune system, are suggested to avoid eating meats sliced at deli counters, unless heated until steaming hot just before serving. The new deaths include two in South Carolina and one each in Florida, Tennessee and New Mexico. Illinois, New Jersey and Virginia have also reported deaths in the outbreak, which genetic testing has linked to liverwurst products manufactured by Boar's Head.Boar's Head has recalled more than 7 million pounds of 71 different meat and poultry products as of July 30, according to the US Department of Agriculture.

Kamala Harris's nod to Republican in cabinet, if elected: Diversity of opinion

The Democratic candidate for the US presidential election, Kamala Harris, on Thursday (US time) said that she might name a Republican to her cabinet if elected, in her first interview since being nominated for the November election. She emphasised "diversity" and serving as President for "all Americans," but said she did not have a particular name in mind. "But I would, I think. I think it's really important. I have spent my career inviting diversity of opinion. I think it's important to have people at the table when some of the most important decisions are being made that have different views, different experiences. And I think it would be to the benefit of the American public to have a member of my Cabinet who was a Republican," Vice President Harris told CNN's Dana Bash.

She stressed, "I have spent my career inviting diversity of opinion". US presidents have previously appointed members of the opposite party to their Cabinet. However,

no such move has been made during the tenure of Joe Biden or former president Donald Trump in the past eight years. Harris, in her interview, explained her stance on several policy matters and insisted that her "values have not changed," even as she is "seeking consensus". 5 dead as Typhoon Shanshan hits Japan, power lines snapped, flight ops hit

At least five people have been killed in southwestern Japan as Typhoon Shanshan made landfall in Kagoshima prefecture, bringing heavy rain and very strong winds as well as snarling air traffic and knocking out power to over a quarter million households. Typhoon Shanshan slowly barrelled up the Japanese archipelago Friday, dumping torrential rains and causing transport havoc as its reported death toll reached five. The typhoon, one of the strongest to hit Japan in decades, had weakened by early morning, though gusts were still reaching 126 kilometres (78 miles) per hour.

Even before making landfall on the island of Kyushu, a landslide caused by the heavy rains preceding it killed three members of the same family late Tuesday in Aichi prefecture, around 1,000 kilometres (600 miles) away. Two more people were reported to have died including a man last seen on a small boat in Kyushu and another whose two-storey home partially collapsed in Tokushima prefecture on the neighbouring island of Shikoku. At least 81 others have been injured, including many hurt by broken glass after the typhoon smashed windows and ripped tiles off roofs when it slammed into Kyushu on Thursday with gusts up to 252 kph. Authorities issued their highest alert in several areas, with more than five million people advised to evacuate, although it was unclear how many

As far away as the town of Ninomiya near Tokyo, authorities urged residents to take "immediate measures" to secure safety such as moving to higher floors after a local river flooded. Some parts of Kyushu saw record rains for August, with the town of Misato recording a staggering 791.5 millimetres (31 inches) in 48 hours, the Japan Meteorological Agency said. Power cuts hit more than Friday that only 6,500 were still without electricity as en- Taiwan and China this year.



gineers repaired damaged transmission lines. Overnight, many motorways were fully or partially closed in Kyushu, as well as others further afield, media reports said. Shinkansen bullet trains remained suspended in Kyushu and were also halted on the major route between Tokyo and Osaka, with operators warning of disruptions elsewhere. Japan Airlines and ANA had already announced the cancellation of more than 600 flights between them for Friday, having scrapped a similar number the previous day, affecting almost 50,000 passengers. Nissan and Honda also halted operations at their Kyushu plants, as did chipmakers including Tokyo Electron, reports said. Shanshan comes in the wake of Typhoon Ampil, which dumped heavy rain that disrupted hundreds of flights and trains this month but caused only minor injuries and damage. Typhoons in the region have been forming closer to coastlines, intensifying more rapidly and lasting longer over land due to climate change, according to a study released last month. Another released by World Weather Attribution (WWA) on Thursday said that climate change turbocharged Typhoon Gaemi,

ABBA asks Donald Trump not to play their music while campaigning

Swedish supergroup ABBA has asked Donald Trump to stop using their music at campaign rallies, but the Republican presidential nominee's campaign says it has permission. "ABBA has recently discovered the unauthorised use of their music and videos at a Trump event through videos that appeared online," said a statement to The Associated Press from the band, whose hits include "Waterloo," "The Winner Takes It All" and "Money, Money, Money." "As a result, ABBA and its representatives have promptly requested the removal and deletion of such content. No request has been received; therefore, no permission or licence has been granted.

A spokesman for the Trump campaign said it had obtained a licence. "The campaign had a licence to play ABBA music through our agreement with BMI and ASCAP, the spokesperson told the AP.ABBA joins a long list of performers who've objected to Trump using their songs. Ahead of the 2020 election, that included Bruce Springsteen, Rihanna, Phil Collins, Pharrell, John Fogerty, Neil Young, Eddy Grant, Panic! at the Disco, R.E.M. and Guns N' Roses. This cycle, Celine Dion asked the candidate to stop using "My Heart Will Go On" and Beyoncé blocked Trump from using her song "Freedom" in a campaign video. In 2016, Adele asked Trump to quit playing her songs at political rallies. Campaigns don't need an artist's express permission to play their songs at rallies as long as the political organisation or the venue has gotten what's known as a blanket licence from the performing rights organisations ASCAP and BMI.Swedish daily newspaper Svenska Dagbladet said its reporter in July attended a Trump rally in Minnesota where "The Winner Takes it All" was played. Universal Music in Sweden said videos had surfaced of ABBA's music being played during at least one Trump event.ABBA, who have

Israel kills five more in West Bank, including wellknown local commander

Jerusalem: The Israeli military says it has killed five more militants in a large-scale operation in the occupied West Bank, including a well-known local commander. There was no immediate Palestinian confirmation of the death of Mohammed Jaber, known as Abu Shujaa, a commander in the Islamic Jihad militant group in the Nur Shams refugee camp. The military said he was killed along with four other militants in a shootout with Israeli forces early Thursday after the five had hidden inside a mosque. It said Abu Shujaa was linked to numerous attacks on Israelis, including a deadly shooting in June, and was planning more. He was reported killed earlier this year, but then made a surprise appearance at the funeral of other militants, where he was hoisted onto the shoulders of a cheering crowd. The military said another militant was arrested in the operation in the West Bank city of Tulkarem, and that a member of Israel's paramilitary Border Police was lightly wounded.Israel launched a large-scale operation in the West Bank overnight into Wednesday. Hamas said 10 of its fighters were killed in different locations, and the Palestinian Health Ministry reported an 11th casualty,

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Airline to operate flights till November 11, will merge ops with Air India thereafter



Vistara will operationally merge into the Tata group's flagship airline Air India on November 11, drawing curtains on the decade-old brand that made a mark for its product and service quality as India's foremost full-service carrier. The wheels for the merger were set in motion in 2022 after the Tata group acquired Air India from the government. "Starting 03 September 2024, customers will, progressively, no longer be able to make bookings with Vistara for travel on or after 12 November 2024. All Vistara aircraft thereafter will be operated by Air India and bookings for the routes operated by these aircraft will be redirected to Air India's website. Vistara will continue to take bookings and operate flights as usual till 11 November 2024," Vistara said in a statement Friday.

"As the merger process moves ahead, regular updates will be shared with customers on the websites and social media channels of Vistara and Air India, and via email. This includes information on web check-in, lounge access, ancillary services, and all other possible touchpoints. All efforts will be made by the dedicated teams across both airlines to ensure a seamless transition," the airline said. The announcement came close on the heels of the government approving Singapore Airlines's investment into the merged carrier. As a joint venture partner in Vistara, Singapore Airlines holds 49 per cent stake in the airline and will have 25.1 per cent stake in the enlarged Air India after the merger. The Indian government's approval to Singapore Airline's Rs 2,059-crore investment in the merged airline was the final hurdle before the merger.

"Air India welcomes the Union Cabinet's approval for the foreign direct investment by Singapore Airlines in Air India. This is an important milestone that facilitates

the merger process between Vistara and Air India, and the broader transformation of the Air India Group," Air India said in a statement. "We are immensely grateful to all our customers for their support and patronage over the last 10 years. As we progress further in our growth journey, we want to emphasize that this merger is about offering them more choice with a larger fleet and a wider network, while elevating the overall travel experience. Vistara and Air India are committed to ensuring that this transition is smooth and hassle-free. We are excited about this new phase in our journey and look forward to welcoming our customers again soon - as Air India," said Vistara's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Vinod Kannan. For Vistara flights on or after November 12, the flight numbers will change to those of Air India, even though in nearly all cases the aircraft, schedule and operating crew will be unchanged until early 2025. All customers already booked on Vistara flights after November 12 will automatically have their reservations converted to Air India flight numbers. This will occur in phases during September, and customers will be individually informed when this occurs. "For our Vistara colleagues, the HR (human resources) teams are working on the transfer of those who have not already been seconded into Air India. As with those who have already joined, we look forward to welcoming our new Air Indians, helping them feel at home, and to having their assistance in catalysing and accelerating the new Air India," Air India's CEO Campbell Wilson said in an internal communication to Air India employees.Kannan, too, shared the news with Vistara employees in an internal communication and thanked them for their contribution to Vistara's growth. Kannan, who is also the chief integration officer for the merger, told Vistara employees about the merger roadmap over the coming weeks and updated them on staff migration and harmonization activities. In new chip push, Centre ready with \$15-bn blueprintUnder the new scheme, the government could also offer capital equipment and ecosystem support such as gases, chemicals, and raw materials needed at assembly and testing plants.AFTER HAVING committed nearly all of the \$10 billion in subsidies under its ambitious semiconductor manufacturing incentive policy, the government has prepared a blueprint for the second phase of the scheme — it could increase the outlay of the programme to \$15 billion, offer capital support for raw materials and gases used in chip manufacturing, and reduce subsidies for assembly and testing plants. The Indian Express has learnt."In a short period of time, we managed to clear four chip proposals including a fabrication plant. The original incentive policy outlay of \$10 billion will almost get over once subsidy payments are made to the entities setting up these facilities. We want to attract more such plants, and therefore, have pegged that the new 2.0 scheme should have a higher outlay of \$15 on so mai we can remain compeniive, given mai many countries are trying to attract chip manufacturing," a senior government official said, requesting anonymity since the discussions are currently private.

India has ambitions to become a major chip hub on the lines of the United States, Taiwan and South Korea, and has been courting foreign companies to set up operations in the country. So far, the country has approved a fabrication plant worth \$11 billion being set up by Tata Electronics in partnership with Taiwan's Powerchip, and three different chip assembly plants being set up by the Tatas, US-based Micron Technology, and Murugappa Group's CG Power in partnership with Japan's Renesas.

In an internal note prepared with the projections for the renewal of the scheme, the government has also decided to reduce the capex subsidy for assembly and testing plants (ATMP/OSAT) from the current 50 per cent to 30 per cent for conventional packaging technologies, and 40 per cent for advanced packaging technologies. THE NEW scheme could see an increased focus on fabrication plants, and more advanced display technologies as India looks to climb the complexity ladder in the chips ecosystem, going beyond packaging and assembly plants where countries such as Malaysia already have a stranglehold. In the first iteration of the incentive policy, which was released in December 2021, the Centre had



offered a 30 per cent capex subsidy for chip packaging and testing plants. However, in September 2022, it had increased the subsidy for such plants to 50 per cent. It is understood that it was done as a precursor to Micron Technology's proposal, as the government wanted to facilitate the company establishing an assembly plant in India, which was eventually approved in June 2023.

Now though, the government wants to go back to its earlier subsidy contribution, there is a growing perception within sections of the administration that it has overspent on packaging and assembly plants. For instance, in Micron's case, nearly 70 per cent of its \$2.7 billion plant will be paid through subsidies offered by the Central Government, and the Gujarat government. The government also does not want to support technology transfer costs under the new incentive scheme, it is understood. This means that companies partnering with others for using their chip manufacturing technology may have to pay out of their own pocket. Under the new scheme, the government could also offer capital equipment and ecosystem support such as gases, chemicals, and raw materials needed at assembly and testing plants. It could also look at incentivising fabrication of micro-LED displays.It is also learnt that Micron Technology's ATMP plant in Gujarat's Sanand is running 133 days behind schedule, due to the company's inability to hire sufficient construction headcount. The Tatas have sought that the requirement for PSMC to demonstrate capability to manufacture 28 nanometre chips should be exempted for extending fiscal support for the node. The government is considering the company's request, but has not come to a conclu-

"It doesn't clog pores but hydrates and refreshes the skin, helps with soft and smooth skin appearance, is gentle on the skin, reduces the appearance of wrinkles, and tackles acne," said Dr Rinky Kapoor, consultant dermatologist, cosmetic dermatologist and dermato-surgeon, The Esthetic Clinics.

How much to use?

Add 2-3 drops of glycerin to your regular moisturiser if you wish to hydrate the skin or mix two spoons of milk with 1 spoonful of glycerin for smoother skin, shared Dr Kapoor. "Dab on a little glycerin diluted with water to



minimise the appearance of pores. It is known to give a youthful glow," added Dr Kapoor.It can be used in the form of a moisturiser, night cream, soap, or mist. However, it will be imperative for everyone to use glycerin only after consulting the expert, stressed Dr Kapoor. "Try to do a patch test before using glycerin. If there is a burning sensation or redness then discontinue usage," said Dr Kapoor.

What to keep in mind?

One should not use undiluted glycerin directly on the face as doing so can dehydrate the skin. "One can even get blisters, a burning sensation, or even skin irritation. Avoid following any trend because your favourite celebrity is doing so.

Shifted from some liberal positions, but my values have not changed: Harris

Savannah: Vice President Kamala Harris has defended shifting away from her some of her more liberal positions in her first major television interview of her presidential campaign, but insisted her "values have not changed" even as she is "seeking consensus". Sitting with her running mate Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, Harris on Thursday was asked about changes in her policies over the years, specifically her reversals on fracking and decriminalizing illegal border crossings. "I think the most important and most significant aspect of my policy perspective and decisions is my values have not changed," Harris replied.

The interview with CNN's Dana Bash gave Harris a chance to try to quell criticism that she has eschewed uncontrolled environments while also giving her a fresh platform to define her campaign and test her political mettle ahead of an upcoming debate with former President Donald Trump set for Sept 10. But it also carried risk as her team tries to build on momentum from the ticket shakeup following Joe Biden's exit and last week's Democratic National Convention. "First and foremost, one of my highest priorities is to do what we can to strengthen and support the middle class," Harris said. "When I look at the aspirations, the goals, the ambitions of the American people, I think that people are ready for a new way forward."The CNN interview was taped at 1:45 pm Thursday at Kim's Cafe, a local Black-owned restaurant in Savannah, Georgia, and aired in the evening. Harris also brushed off Trump's questioning of her racial identity after the former President said she "happened to turn Black". Harris, who is of Black and South Asian heritage, said it



was the "same old, tired playbook". "Next question." She also said she'd name a Republican to serve in her Cabinet if she were elected, though she didn't have a name in mind.

Joint interviews during an election year are a fixture in politics; Biden and Harris, Trump and Mike Pence, Barack Obama and Biden — all did them at a similar point in the race. The difference is those other candidates had all done solo interviews, too. Harris hasn't yet done an in-depth interview since she became her party's standard bearer five weeks ago, though she did sit for several while she was still Biden's running mate. Harris and Walz are still introducing themselves to voters, unlike Trump and Biden, of whom people had near-universal awareness and opinion. Harris said serving with Biden was "one of the greatest honours of my career," as she recounted the moment he called to tell her he was stepping down and would support her.

RIL plans 1:1 bonus issue; to invest Rs 75,000 cr in new energy ecosystem



Seven years after its previous bonus issue, Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) on Thursday said it proposes to issue a bonus issue in the ratio of one-for-one to the shareholders and invest up to Rs 75,000 crore to establish the manufacturing ecosystem in new energy businesses, extensively enabled by all emerging technologies including AI, IoT, Machine Learning and Robotics.

Addressing the annual general meeting of RIL, Chairman and MD Mukesh Ambani said RIL is targeting to double its revenues and EBITDA (earnings before interest, tax, depreciation and amortisation) over the next three to four years, led by the momentum in connectivity. "RIL has sent a notice to the stock exchanges that the Board of Directors will meet on September 5 to consider issuing bonus shares in the ratio of 1:1. When Reliance grows, we reward our shareholders hand-somely," Ambani said. The last bonus issue that RIL had announced was in 2017 in the ratio of 1:1. It had announced four bonus issues since 1983.

By 2025, Jamnagar will become the cradle new energy business, he said. The Dhirubhai Ambani Green Energy Giga Manufacturing Complex will be the world's largest, most modern, modular, and integrated ecosystem at a single location, he said. "Our complete ownership and automation of the integrated value chains will allow us to maximise margins that are higher than those of stand-alone, non-integrated players. To support our investments, we are committed to partnering with leading global technology companies, building world class, state-of-the-art R&D capabilities, and expanding our large, dynamic talent pool of PhDs, technologists, and engineers from various nationalities," Ambani said. He said Reliance spent over Rs 3,643 crore in FY24 towards R&D, taking RIL's spend on research to over Rs 11,000 crore (\$1.5 billion) in the last four years alone. "We have more than 1,000 scientists and researchers

working on critical research projects across all our businesses. Last year Reliance filed over 2,555 patents, mainly in the areas of bio-energy innovations, solar and other green energy sources, and high-value chemicals," he said. According to Ambani, by the end of this year, RIL will commence the production of its own solar photovoltaic (PV) modules. "In the following quarters, we will complete the first phase of our integrated solar production facilities. This includes modules, cells, glass, wafer, ingot, and polysilicon, with an initial annual capacity of 10 GW. Our giga-factory is designed for modular expansion at minimal cost and in the shortest time possible," he said. "We have fully integrated and indigenised the HJT technology from REC Singapore, our wholly owned subsidiary, to develop 1 Gen bifacial solar panels with cell efficiency exceeding 26 per cent," he said.

RIL has already begun construction of an integrated advanced chemistry-based battery manufacturing facility with a 30 GWh annual capacity at Jamnagar. "Production will commence by second half of next year. We will start by assembling Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) for utility scale applications and pack solutions for residential, commercial, industrial, telecom, and mobility markets," Ambani said.Progressively, over the next few quarters, RIL will integrate backward to cell manufacturing and eventually to battery chemicals production. This will create the world's only fully integrated battery giga-factory, driving synergies across the value chain, be said

RIL has begun work on establishing a fully automated, multi-GW electrolyser manufacturing facility on the west coast of India, which will be ready by 2026, he said. "This giga-factory will be fully adaptable, capable of supporting various technologies such as Alkaline, PEM and AEM. The facility is built using Industry 4.0 standards and will be expandable in a modular fashion to meet market demand," he said. "In parallel, we are building capabilities for futuristic electrolysis-based technologies to tackle challenges in energy efficiency and capital cost reduction for our next-gen electrolysers," he said.RIL arm Reliance Retail said it has ambitious plans to enter the luxury jewellery segment with a curated and design-led experience. "We are exploring the fashion jewellery and accessories segment to broaden our market reach," RIL Director Isha Ambani said.Ambani said the retail arm is establishing 7-Eleven as a leading 24×7 convenience destination, offering localised fresh food and beverages tailored to the Indian palate. "I am confident that we will achieve our goal of doubling our retail business in the next 3 to 4 years," she said.

Uncontrolled diabetes very often may be asymptomatic, making many patients 'feel fine'. However, that is an inaccurate way to assess one's diabetes level. Conditions like diabetes warrant the continuity of medications as an interruption or sudden stoppage may lead to an increased risk of infections and the possibility of acute complications like diabetic ketoacidosis, a lifethreatening condition characterised by the buildup of acids in the blood, which can lead to coma if not treated promptly," explained Dr Gupta. He added that the silent nature of diabetes can be tricky, and diabetics often may not feel anything till it is too late. "Stopping medications can also lead to glycaemic variability and increase chances of long-term complications like blindness, kidney failure, and leg amputations. There is also the possibility of muscle and weight loss, dehydration, fatigue, and

Dimple Kapadia once revealed that during her marriage to Rajesh Khanna, she "never got a word of praise" from him, despite dedicating all her energy to meeting his expectations. Khanna, who was one of the most sought-after stars in Bollywood back in the 60s and 70s, married Kapadia when she was just a teenager. The couple split in the early 80s after their daughters Twinkle and Rinke were born. In an interview with Screen magazine in 1987, Kapadia reflected on her relationship with a man twice her age, revealing that the superstar was aware of the admiration she had for him. She said, "Everywhere I went, I was told that I was the most gorgeous woman in the world. But I never got a word of praise from him. It was as if he hadn't noticed me."She went on to add, "I was always waiting for some reaction, but it never came. All my energy was spent in doing what he wanted and anticipating his approval. It was like climbing a ladder. No matter how fast I climbed, he was still many rungs ahead."

Positive reinforcement and appreciation are crucial aspects of relationships. When one partner constantly feels unrecognised or unappreciated, it can lead to deep-seated feelings of inadequacy and emotional disconnect, undermining the foundation of the relationship.

Rhea Joseph, consultant psychiatric social worker and relationship counsellor at Cadabams Hospitals, tells indianexpress.com, "When individuals feel valued and acknowledged, they experience a boost in self-esteem and are more likely to maintain healthy emotional ties with their partner. However, the absence of positive reinforcement can lead to significant psychological impacts, creating feelings of inadequacy and emotional disconnect." Absence of positive reinforcement and its effects on self-esteem and emotional well-being

Joseph says, "Without reinforcement, individuals may begin to doubt their value, both within the relationship and in their lives more broadly. Feeling unseen or unappreciated often leads to a gradual erosion of selfworth. This can be particularly damaging in relationships

where one partner is consistently striving to meet the other's needs without receiving validation or praise in return." IC 814: Captain Devi Sharan told jokes to hijacker named Burger, who 'won the hearts' of hostages by singing songs

The release of Anubhav Sinha's new streaming series, IC 814: The Kandahar Hijack, has reintroduced the harrowing incident to the minds of Indian audiences. The six-episode series, based in part on Captain Devi Sharan's account of the week-long siege, was released to positive reviews on August 29. In the show, the captain is played by Vijay Varma, while the rest of the impressive cast plays various bureaucrats who found themselves working around a system to ensure the safe return of Indian citizens. The stand-off ended on December 31, 1999, and Captain Devi Sharan got a hero's welcome in India.

In an interview with The New York Times five days after his return, he spoke about the mood inside the plane, and recalled that the hijackers and hostages began to loosen up as the days wore on. He even recalled telling the hijackers a joke, which he narrated in the interview as well. "I just wanted to make the best of that time, so that nobody should be nervous and think the world is finished now," he said, recalling how the hijacker named Burger 'won the hearts of people' by singing songs with them and chatting 'companionably'. Captain Sharan, too, 'joined in the games'. He added, "Whenever the hijackers laughed, we laughed. Whenever they were tense, we were tense." Captain Sharan then recalled the joke that he told during one of these interactions with the hijackers and hostages. "Like one guy was traveling with a parrot. See, an air hostess comes, so the parrot kisses her. OK? The master of that parrot thinks I can also do that. He also kisses her. The commander comes out and asks, 'Why did you do this?' The master says, 'Because my parrot



did that.' So the commander decided to throw them both out of the plane, the parrot and the master. They opened the door. The parrot asks his master, 'Can you fly?'"Captain Sharan, who began flying only a few days after the ordeal, declared in the NYT interview that he was prepared to return to work, and that he was 'ready to face another hijack also'. In more recent interviews, director Anubhav Sinha also shared anecdotes that he gathered from his interactions with Captain Sharan, who told him about the camaraderie that emerged in the cabin as the siege wore on, and about the mark that remains on his neck from where the hijackers kept him at gunpoint.

In 1999, a passenger airliner from Kathmandu was hijacked by a group of terrorists, eventually landing in Kandahar. There, the Indian authorities engaged the hijackers in negotiations, ultimately agreeing to release three high-ranking terrorists in exchange of the hostages. One person was murdered.

Shakib Al Hasan becomes cricket's most successful left-arm spinner surpassing Daniel Vettori with 707 wickets in 444 internationals

The exponential growth of left-arm spinners must rank among the striking differences in international cricket between the 20th and 21st centuries. The proliferation of games has helped, but so has the rise of a clan that has become an integral part of the modern game. In only 23 years of this century, left-arm spinners have overhauled the aggregates of their predecessors from a hundred years between January 1901 and December 2000.

Overall, 194 left-arm spin bowlers had bowled in the previous century, amassing over 6000 international wickets at a trifling 77.2 strike rate. Since the turn of the century and the expansion to three formats, left-arm tweakers have doubled (408) in representation, aggregating over 13600 wickets across formats, with their strike rate halved to 43.5. (AP)A closer understanding of the progression can be derived from the Test format. 169 left-arm spinners played in the previous century, claiming 4508 wickets at an 86.6 strike-rate. The figures have surged remarkably since 2001, with 120 left-arm spinners already accounting for 90.97 percent of wickets (4101) from the 20th century at an improved 70.5 strike rate. Shakib Al Hasan has led the revolution of the left-arm spin tribe between the two contrasting periods in a nearly 17-year active career. Last Sunday in Rawalpindi, the Bangladeshi maverick surpassed Daniel Vettori to become the most successful left-arm spinner, soaring to 707 wickets in 444 international appearances. Shakib ranks 16th in the all-time list and remains the solitary bowler to record at least 100 T20I, 200 Test and 300 ODI wickets. No other player has achieved a double of 14,000 runs and 700 wickets in

Only 10 bowlers have picked up at least 400 international wickets at home. The 37-year-old Shakib (415) ranks 10th on the list and has the third-highest percentage (58.69) of wickets at home, only behind R Ashwin (61.15) and Stuart Broad (60.09). That does not necessarily reduce Shakib's effectiveness, having played in an underdog side throughout his career. None have featured in more Bangladesh victories over the years. Shakib has played in 183 of his country's 247 international wins, scoring 6347 runs (second-most) and totalling 336 wickets,

(PTI Photo) Dissecting him by format, his efficacy barely takes a hit. Shakib stands fifth among all left-arm tweakers in Tests. He is one of just three from the group to cross 300 ODI wickets and is only seven short of surpassing Sanath Jayasuriya's tally of 323 wickets. A wicket will make him only the third T20I bowler to reach 150 wickets. Shakib's unique strain of dominance may go unnoticed in Bangladesh's mercurial performances over the years and his spate of controversies on and off the field have somewhat tarnished his legacy. Alleged involvement in a murder case back home has thrown the improbable twilight years of his career into further unpredictability. Despite this wave of uncertainty, Shakib will remain a delight for the record books for decades as an unremitting all-rounder and undisputed man of action from the left-armers club.

gifted his opponent another break with a double fault and Van de Zandschulp went on to comfortably double his advantage in the match. After briefly leaving the court before the third set, Alcaraz found himself in deeper trouble after a wayward forehand handed Van de chuln a break He bit back immediately and found his smile again, but world number 74 Van de Zandschulp got his nose in front and completed a stunning upset on serve."Actually I am a little bit lost for words. It's been an incredible evening here," said Van de Zandschulp. "I think from point one here today I believed (I had) a chance."I had some nerves but I think if you want to beat one of these guys you have to be unbelievably calm and keep your head there."

New Champions League format: Why PSG has the toughest draw?

"Football and our lives are managed by memories," Cristiano Ronaldo said at the Champions league draw in Monaco. The UEFA would hope that the new format of the league would produce plenty of those as after months of buildup, UCL dived headfirst into unchartered territory as the familiar group stage of the tournament was relegated to the pages of the past and replaced with a swanky league model consisting of 36 teams. With a computer deciding the draw, replacing the earlier tradition of the names of the teams being picked from glass bowls manually, the Champions League went all digital for the new season. And as promised by UEFA, the new format did throw up some mouthwatering clashes from the get go with huge names like Real Madrid taking on Liverpool, Manchester City facing off against Juventus and Bayern Munich locking horns with Barcelona.

Defending champions Real Madrid will take on Liverpool, Borussia Dortmund and AC Milan while Manchester City will be playing big names like Inter Milan, Paris Saint Germain and Juventus. Bayern Munich, meanwhile, will face PSG and Barcelona while PSG will also take on Arsenal. Dortmund, last season's finalists have both Real and Barca to contend with while Liverpool will have to face Bayer Leverkusen as well as AC Milan in addition to the clash with Real Madrid. Arsenal, meanwhile, have to take on PSG and Inter Milan.

Who among the big teams has the easier draw?

Among the traditional big teams, Juventus will be happy with the way that the draw turned out with the Italian powerhouse having just Manchester City at home to worry about. Their other fixtures are with RB Leipzig (A), Benfica (H), Club Brugge (A), PSV (H), Lille (A), Stuttgart (H) and Aston Villa (A).

Who among the big teams has the toughest draw?

Paris Saint Germain just can't seem to catch a break here as after their superstar Kylian Mbappe got transferred to Real Madrid, the draw wasn't in their favour as well with the Parisians having to take on Manchester City and Atletico Madrid at home and then face off with Bayern Munich and Arsenal away. Their remaining fixtures are PSV (H), Salzburg (A), Girona (H), Stuttgart (A).Bundesliga champions Bayer Leverkusen will also feel shortchanged by the draw with Xabi Alonso's Invincibles facing tough tasks against Inter and AC Milan at home while travelling to face Liverpool and Atletico Madrid.

A little bit of historyQuite a few teams in the initial phase of matches have storied history behind their encounters. As Barcelona gets set to welcome Bayern Munich at home, fans will instantly be reminded of that fateful clash in 2020 when the Bavarians obliterated a Barca side with the likes of Lionel Messi and Luiz Suarez 8-2, a day that is still looked on in infamy among the Catalan club faithful. It hasn't helped that in the UCL, Barca have just 2 victories against the Germans with Bayern winning 10. Another match which has a recent history in the Champions League is between Real Madrid and Liverpool with the defending champions being the source of numerous heartbreaks for the Reds in this competition. In the 2021/22 and 2017/18 finals, Madrid snatched away the Merseysideiders' dreams of the trophy when they beat them 0-1 and 3-1 respectively. In the 2022/23 season, Real eliminated Liverpool from the Round of 16 with an aggregate score of 6-2 while in the 2020/21 quarters, the Spanish team again ousted the English giants 3-1 on aggregate. Real will also play Dortmund which will be a repeat of last year's final. Another clash with a little bit of history to it will be when Aston Villa play host to Bayern Munich, a team who they had beaten in 1982 to win the European Cup. That was before the competition was renamed the Champions League in 1992 and this will be the first time since the rebrand that Villa will be playing the tournament.

Potential banana-skin fixturesThis year, teams will be wary of Girona who after an inspired run last season finished third in the La Liga. In the UCL, they face off against Liverpool and Arsenal in home fixtures while taking on PSG and AC Milan away. Aston Villa are another team to look out for, having finished fourth in the Premier League over traditional giants like Manchester United and Chelsea. Even though the Unai Emery team have to face Bayern, Leipzig and Juventus, their in-form goalie Emiliano Martinez and striker Oliie Watkins might help them pull the so-called rabbit out of the hat.

Archer Sheetal Devi shoots an incredible 703, just one short of new World Record

In the end, as it often does at the highest level, it came down to one arrow. A few centimeters. One 9 in a sea of 10s and bull's eyes. The two archers who are considered to be favourites for the Women's Individual Compound Open title at Paris Paralympics pushed each other all the way in the qualification rounds. India's Sheetal Devi shot a sensational 703 out of a possible 720... but Turkey's Oznur Cure went one better in the final End of six arrows to score 704. Both archers comfortably bettered the existing World Record of 698, but it was Cure who came away with the new global benchmark on a day of remarkable shooting by the two favourites. It was a battle royale for the top two spots as Cure made a strong comeback in the second half while Sheetal was largely steady in the top two from the get go. In the second half, Sheetal both archers where tied on 644 points. While Sheetal managed a fine 59 in the final End, Cure shot six 10s. According to World Archery, it literally came down to the last arrow after both of them shot five 10s from 644. Overall out of 72 arrows in qualification, Sheetal shot 59 10s out of which 24 were inner ring Xs, while her Turkish opponent shot 56 10s with 29 Xs. In the process, they became the first two women in the history of this discipline to cross 700 in the 72-arrow qualification format.

Of course, the ranking rounds only determine the seedings and Sheetal, the only female armless archer competing at Paris Paralympics, ensured that she wouldn't have to face Cure anytime before the final should both athletes make it that far. If they do, it will be a repeat of the Pilsen 2023 World Archery Para Championships final, where Cure overcame Sheetal's challenge. The 17year-old Indian prodigy from Kishtwar, Jammu and Kashmir, was born with Phocomelia, a rare congenital disorder that causes under-developed limbs. She uses her right feet, right shoulder and jaw to release the arrow and gets the upper body strength from a penchant for climbing trees as a kid. Coming into Paris, she was already earmarked as one of the medal contenders in her category and by comfortably smashing her previous personal best of 689 in the qualification round, she made a strong start on her path to the podium. Sheetal made headlines during the Para Asian Games last year as well when she won two gold medals and a silver. Shooting alongside Sheetal in this event, Sarita finished 9th in the ranking round. While Sarita will begin her knockout campaign in the round of 32, Sheetal gets a bye into the round of 16. In the men's individual recurve open ranking round, Harvinder Singh - who made history in Tokyo as the first archer from India to win a medal at either of the Summer Games - earned 9th seeding with a score of

In men's compound, Rakesh had a solid outing too, finishing 5th with a total of 696. A combined total of 1399 was enough to give India the top seeding in mixed team compound. And also, that meant it was a new World Record score for mixed team qualification in compound, combined with Sheetal's 703. In women's recurve, Pooja was placed 7th with a score of 585, which also earned India 5th seed in mixed team along with Harvinder.If Sheetal's was a case of Paralympic debut going as well as possible, it was double heartbreak for Aruna Tanwar in Para Taekwondo. Back in Tokyo on her debut, Aruna had fought through to the quarterfinals despite a hairline fracture, but it became serious enough for her to miss out on repechage. Three years on, it was a brutal leg injury that ended her hopes early.

Early in her bout against Turkey's Nurcihan Ekinci, the 24-year-old appeared to have her right knee buckled as she fell forward. She let out an immediate cry of pain that echoed in the arena and laid on her back as she was



treated for a considerable amount of time. As she got up in tears and decided to fight till the end of the stipulated five minutes, the audience applauded her on. It was however too much for the Indian to manage as she lost 0-19 and limped off the playing area in tears. In Para Badminton, there were comfortable group-stage wins for medal contenders like Suhas Yathiraj (SL4), Nihya Sre Sumathy Sivan (SH6) and Palak Kohli (SL4). But the standout results of the day came from Sukant Kadam and Manisha Ramadass. While Sukant (SL3), making his Paralympics debut after missing out in 2021, fought back from a game down against Malaysian fourth seed Mohd Amin Burhanuddin. In the decider, Sukant trailed 16-20 facing four match points, but won six in a row to register an impressive win. Later, Manisha Ramadass (SU5) came back from a slow start to clinch a three-game battle against local favorite Maud Lefort. In a group that also has reigning World and Paralympic champion Qiu Xia Yang, it was a must-win for Manisha and she held her nerve in the

Suhas Yathiraj, Sukant Kadam start singles campaigns on winning note

Paris: Tokyo 2020 silver medallist Suhas Lalinakere Yathiraj had a mixed day while Sukant Kadam won his opening match in the group stage on the opening day of badminton competitions in the Paralympic Games here on Thursday. Yathiraj, who is an IAS officer of the 2007 batch of Uttar Pradesh cadre and has served as District Magistrate of Gautam Buddha Nagar & Prayagraj, started the day with a defeat in the Mixed Doubles SL3-SU 5 partnering Palak Kohli. They lost to compatriots Nitesh Kumar and Thulasimathi Murugesan 0-2 (14-21, 17-21) at Court 4 of the La Chapelle Arena in the French Capital.

The 41-year-old shuttler then came back a couple of hours later to start his campaign in the men's singles SL4 on a rousing note, defeating Indonesia's Hikmat Ramdani 21-7, 21-5 in just 22 minutes in his first match in Group A.Kyung Hwan Shin of South Korea is the third player in the preliminary Group A. Yathiraj will have to next beat the Korean to advance as only the group winners make it to the semifinals. In the same SL4 category, India's Sukant Kadam and Tarun Dhillon also won their first match in their respective groups. Yathiraj is the top seed in his

In Group B, Kadam started his campaign with a hardfought three-game win over fourth seed Mohd Amin Burhanuddin of Malaysia. Kadam defeated the Malaysian 2-1 (17-21, 21-15, 22-20) in a 61-minute encounter. Thailand's Siripong Teamarrom is the third player in the

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
