Supreme Court substitutes SIT to include CBI

GNS News Agency, Oct 4 On hearing the plea of

the alleged use of animal fat in making Tirupati laddus, the Supreme Court has substituted the Special Investigation Team (SIT) constituted by the Andhra Pradesh government with two CBI officers, two Andhra Pradesh State Police officers, and a representative of the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI). The court clarified that the constitution of the independent SIT was not a remark on the current SIT set up by the State government. "The independent SIT was formed to assuage the feelings of crores of people who worship the Tirumala Tirupathi temple deity," the Bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan explained. The two CBI officers in the new SIT would be nominated by the agency's Director. The State police officers would be picked by the Andhra Pradesh government. The FSSAI representative would be chosen by the



authority chairperson.The court has disposed of the petitions, including one by former Rajya Sabha member Dr. Subramanian Swamy. The pleas had sought an independent probe into the allegations by a retired Supreme Court judge or High Court Chief Justice. The court had agreed that the allegations had the "potential to hurt the sentiments of people world-wide".

Earlier in the day, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said he had no problem with the SIT constituted by the Andhra Pradesh government. "They are competent," he noted and suggested the SIT may be supervised by a senior police officer from the Centre. Andhra Pradesh State too agreed for the Supreme Court adding members of its choice. Appearing for the State, senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi said there was conclusive proof that lard (animal fat from pig) was used. "the lab report was of July. Key details of PM Internship Scheme revealed

New Delhi: The Modi government has introduced the PM Internship Scheme which aims to benefit around 10 million young people over the next five years. Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had announced this scheme during the Union Budget for the financial year 2024-25.

Under the scheme, each intern will receive a monthly allowance of Rs 5,000, and after one year, a lumpsum of Rs 6,000 as an additional benefit from the government. The official website for the PM Internship Scheme went live on Thursday. The government has also confirmed that reservation policies will be followed for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and Other Backward Classes candidates in this scheme. Registration for the scheme will start on October 12 and continue until October 25.

Those interested in enrolling in this pilot project can register within this period. The technology partner for this internship scheme is the Bhaskaracharya Institute for Space Applications and Geoinformatics (BISAG). The company will shortlist candidates between October 27 and November 7, and the selected candidates will have the opportunity to decide on the internship offer between November 8 and November 15.The internship programme, scheduled to start on December 2, would last for 13 months.Out of Rs 5,000 stipend, Rs 500 will come from companies as part of their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds, and the remaining Rs 4,500 will be provided by the government. The estimated cost of this pilot project is around Rs 800 crore. Advertisements for the internship scheme have already been released in multiple regional languages. The government aims to provide as many internships as possible in the districts where candidates reside. People aged 21 and 24, who passed their 10th-grade exams and hold a valid certificate and mark sheet, can apply for the scheme. According to reports, 111 companies out of the top 500 have already enrolled in this programme.

EAM Jaishankar to visit Pakistan to attend SCO meeting on October 15-16

External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar will lead the Indian delegation's visit to Pakistan to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) 'Heads of Government' (HoG) meeting in Islamabad on October 15-16, the Ministry of External Affairs announced on Friday (October 4, 2024). Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu is also expected to visit India from October 7 to October 10, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal announced in a weekly press briefing. While Mr. Muizzu will arrive in India on October 6 late evening, this marks the first bilateral visit by the President to India. Mr. Muizzu will also visit Mumbai and Bengaluru. Earlier, The Hindu reported that the External Affairs Minister was likely to be New Delhi's choice to attend the summit virtually, or inperson.No Indian Minister has attended a multilateral meeting in Pakistan since Home Minister Rajnath Singh visited Islamabad for the SAARC Home Minister's meeting in August 2016. The last time an External Affairs Minister visited Pakistan was Sushma Swaraj in December 2015. After terror attacks on the Pathankot airbase and the Uri Army camp in 2016, India called off the SAARC Summit in Pakistan and has refused to attend any subsequent meetings in Pakistan. The only exceptions made by the government in the last few years is for the inauguration of the Kartarpur corridor, where it sent two Union Ministers. While Mr. Modi is technically the Head of Government, both India and Pakistan decided when they joined the regional grouping including China, Russia and Central Asia, that their elected leaders would participate in the Heads of State summit, alongside Presidents of the other countries and not the HoG. As a result, Mr. Modi has thus far deputed the Vice-President or External Affairs Minister to attend SCO HoG conferences.

Delhi drug bust: Congress leader's 'involvement' dangerous, shameful, says Amit Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday (October 4, 2024) said the "involvement" of a prominent Congress leader in the ?5,600 crore drug bust in north India is "extremely dangerous and shameful". Mr. Shah also said that everyone has seen the plight of the youth of Punjab, Haryana and the entire north India due to drugs during the Congress rule."While on one hand the Modi government is adopting a zero-tolerance policy for a 'drug-free India', the involvement of a prominent Congress leader in the ?5,600 crore drug consignment seized from north India is extremely dangerous and shameful," the Minister wrote on X in Hindi. He said that while the Modi government is taking the youth towards sports, education and innovation, the "Congress wants to take them into the dark world of drugs". "Our government is determined to

make India a 'drug-free country' by destroying the entire drug network, without looking at the political position or stature of the drug dealers," he added. In one of Delhi's biggest drug busts, police seized over 560 kilograms of cocaine and 40 kilograms of hydroponic marijuana estimated to be worth around ?5,620 crore earlier this week. The BJP on Thursday (October 3, 2024) alleged that the kingpin, Tushar Goel, arrested in connection with the seizure of drugs is the chairman of the Delhi Youth Congress' RTI cell, a claim refuted by the opposition party as baseless. The Indian Youth Congress (IYC) said in a statement that Goel was expelled from the organisation on October 17, 2022, for anti-party activities soon after BJP spokesperson and MP Sudhanshu Trivedi charged the opposition party with having links with drug dealers.

Doctors targeted

THE shooting of Dr Javed Akhtar at a Delhi hospial on Thursday, following the brutal rape and murder of a doctor in Kolkata in mid-August, raises an urgent question: how many more doctors on duty must be killed before the authorities take decisive action to ensure heir safety? The medical profession, built on the fundamental principle of saving lives, is under siege. Docors, who work tirelessly and selflessly, often in hazardous conditions, are becoming easy targets for violence. Whether it is the horrifying attack on Dr Akhtar, shot at point-blank range, or the brutal killing in Kolkata that sparked nationwide protests and strikes by doctors, the pattern is clear. A lack of adequate security measures in hospitals is leaving healthcare professionals vulnerable to targeted assaults.

The Supreme Court, while hearing the Kolkata ase, expressed grave concerns over the West Bengal Sovernment's slow progress in installing CCTV cameras and constructing basic facilities such as toilets and resting rooms. These are not new demands; they re essential security measures that should have been mplemented long ago. The court even set a deadline of October 15 for the state to complete these improvenents. Yet, progress remains sluggish.Doctors continue o work under constant fear, forced to protest in the treets instead of focusing on their duties. How many nore protests, strikes and loss of lives will it take for the authorities to realise the gravity of the situation? Medial associations across India have repeatedly called or stricter enforcement of safety protocols and ennanced security at hospitals, but these appeals have nostly gone unanswered. Every life lost under such circumstances is a tragic reminder of the failure to proect those who dedicate their lives to saving others.

The Punjab and Haryana High Court on Tuesday directed the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the Haryana Police to arrest Congress MLA Dharam Singh Chhoker if he fails to surrender within 24 hours.

Chhoker, considered a close aide of Congress Legislative Party (CLP) leader and former chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, is seeking re-election from the Samalkha constituency in the Haryana Assembly elections scheduled for October 5.He is facing a case registered by the ED on charges of money laundering and other offences. About five months ago, the ED arrested his son Sikander Singh in the same case. Chhoker was yet to be arrested despite a non-bailable warrant issued

Last week, a petition was filed in the high court by one Virender Singh, who claimed to be a social activist. The petitioner alleged that while Chhoker was wanted by the police and ED in the case, he continued to evade his arrest. The petitioner said that Chhoker had filed his nomination papers and had been campaigning in the constituency. Though his campaigning details had been widely circulated on social media, the petitioner alleged he had not yet been arrested. Last week, the high court issued notice to the ED and the Haryana Police, and the case was listed for Tuesday, when the fresh directions were issued. In 2023, the ED took over a case registered against Chhoker and his son Sikander on charges of money laundering. Multiple raids were conducted at his premises in Samalkha. The Gurgaon police filed an initial FIR against Chhoker and his son Sikander, claiming that they were the owners and promoters of Mihira Group, a real estate company.

The complainants claimed that the Mihira Group had taken on a project to construct flats in Sector 68 of Gurgaon under the affordable housing initiative and had applied for licenses from the Directorate of Town and Country Planning Department of Haryana. It was further alleged that although the approval was granted, the project was supposed to be completed by 2021-22. The company allegedly began selling flats and collected approximately Rs 363 crore from 1,500 home buyers. However, the company allegedly failed to fulfil its commitment and allegedly defrauded the home buyers. Last year, during the raids, the ED seized Chhoker's luxury SUVs and recovered cash and jewellery worth lakhs of rupees from his premises. Dharam Singh, a former policeman, was elected for the first time from Salakha on a Haryana Janhit Congress ticket in 2009. Later, he joined the Congress. He lost the 2014 Assembly polls as a Congress candidate. In 2019, he contested again and defeated the BJP's Shashikant Kaushik

Firing and stone-pelting in Zira amid nomination filing for Punjab panchayat polls; ex-MLA among injured

Supporters of the ruling AAP and the Congress clashed at Zira in Punjab's Ferozepur district on Tuesday afternoon as candidates from both parties attempted to file nominations for the upcoming sarpanch polls.Former Congress MLA Kulbir Singh Zira was injured along with two of his supporters. They alleged that AAP MLA Naresh Kataria's men prevented Congress candidates from filing papers and resorted to firing and stone-pelting. But the AAP accused supporters of the Opposition party of starting the violence.

Three Congress supporters sustained injuries, which police said were not from gunfire. Zira's personal assistant, Rubal Singh, said, "Firing was done by Zira MLA Naresh Kataria's men. Our 30-year-old supporter Gurvinder Singh Gary got injuries to his thigh and wrist, while Harpreet Singh Kala and the ex-MLA also got injured. They are all admitted to the civil hospital in Zira. Our side did not fire as we had nothing in our hands."In a

video, a visibly injured Zira was seen arguing with police officials. "My supporters were barehanded while Kataria's men came with arms and stones and they attacked us. We came to file nomination papers... Is there any law and order in the state?"The clash occurred near Jeevan World School in Zira, where nominations were to be filed. There are 231 villages in the Zira constituency and candidates from about 107 villages from both the AAP and the Congress were expected to file papers. Residents alleged that in 2018, when the Congress was in power, Zira, as sitting MLA, restricted candidates of other parties from filing nominations, allowing Congress-backed sarpanches to win uncontested. In Zira, only AAP-backed candidates have so far filed nominations, which will close on October 4.The Indian Express's attempts to contact Naresh Kataria were unsuccessful. His son, Shankar Kataria, is said to have led AAP supporters to the school. "Get ready today... we will return the 'sweets' today," he posted on Facebook earlier. The police used water cannons to disperse the crowd.Randhir Kumar, Superintendent of Police, said, "We are investigating and recording statements from both parties. We are verifying if firing occurred on the site. Some minor injuries have been reported on both sides. We are determining the total number of injured people.

Tuesday's firing incident in Zira was the second in two days, even as arms are supposed to be deposited at the deputy commissioner's office in view of the panchayat polls. On Monday, there was firing outside the block development officer's office in Ferozepur city as candidates attempted to file nominations. As per an FIR registered over the firing, an ex-sarpanch snatched a government employee's bag containing documents and fired shots into the air before fleeing in a car.

Bombay HC upholds death sentence of man convicted for murdering mother, eating her organs: 'barbaric and grotesque'

Bombay HC upholds conviction of man sentenced to deathA division bench of Justices Revati Mohite-Dere and Prithviraj K Chavan passed the judgement on pleas by Sunil Rama Kuchkoravi challenging his conviction and one by the state government seeking confirmation of the death penalty awarded to him.

The Bombay High Court on Tuesday upheld the death penalty awarded to a Kolhapur man for murdering his mother by disembowelling her body to eat her body parts in 2017.A division bench of Justices Revati Mohite-Dere and Prithviraj K Chavan passed the judgement on pleas by Sunil Rama Kuchkoravi challenging his conviction and one by the state government seeking confirmation of the death penalty awarded to him. Kuchkoravi is presently lodged at Yerwada Central Prison. "We confirm the sentence of death. The convict is informed about his right to take an appeal before the Supreme Court in 30 days. The convict not only murdered his mother but also removed her body parts and he was about to cook her heart and was about to eat it. This is a case of cannibalism and we found it worth it to be of the rarest of rare category. There is no scope for his reformation as his tendency is cannibalism. It is a barbaric grotesque murder of the mother," the bench noted. The prosecution claimed that Kuchkoravi murdered his 63-year-old mother Yallama Rama Kuchkoravi on the afternoon of August 28, 2017, in Makadwala Vasahat in Kolhapur city. He later desecrated the body and ate some of the organs after frying them in a pan.

In July 2021, the sessions court in Kolhapur convicted Kuchkoravi and sentenced him to be hanged to death for murdering his mother and extracting her body organs with the intention to cook and eat them. The trial



court observed it was "the rarest of the rare" cases and said it "shook the social conscience of the society." The sessions court also observed that there was no repentance or remorse in Kuchkoravi's behaviour following committing the crime."The pain which she (the mother) had experienced cannot be explained in words. He has committed the offence in order to satisfy his lust for liquor. He forcibly eliminated the life of his helpless mother, which is the ultimate insult of motherhood," additional sessions judge Mahesh Krishnaji Jadhav observed then. The state government, in 2021, filed a plea in the Bombay High Court seeking confirmation of the death penalty, which is still pending. Advocate Yug Mohit Chaudhry, appearing for the appellant, informed the bench that the motive of the act was unknown and even his family was shocked. The high court also sought psychiatric and a psychological report, as well as a probation welfare officer's report of Kuchkoravi.In February last year, the high court allowed Kuchkoravi to attend his daughter's wedding with

Badlapur sexual abuse case: Bombay High Court rejects pre-arrest bail pleas of chairperson, secretary of school

The Bombay High Court observed that the victims would endeavour trauma, leaving them with irreversible psychological scars.

BadlapurA division bench of Justices Revati Mohite Dere and Prithviraj Chavan questioned as to how the police, that usually go to any extent to nab an accused, are unable to arrest them in this case. (Express archives)The Bombay High Court rejected the anticipatory bail pleas by the absconding chairperson and the secretary of a Badlapur school where two minor students were allegedly sexually abused by a janitor in August. The duo were booked for failing to report the alleged sexual abuse to the police as per provisions of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (Pocso) Act. The two members of the school management, under investigation and currently on the run, approached the high court after a special court designated under the Pocso Act in Kalyan rejected their pre-arrest bail plea earlier this month

"Considering that victims are minors, the trauma they endeavour can affect their adolescent years leaving them with lasting and irreversible psychological scars. And there is significant risk that in this case applicants may exert pressure on witness and tamper. In light of these circumstances, the PP rightly argued that this case is not appropriate for granting anticipatory bail," Justice Rajesh N Laddha noted in the order. The applicants claimed that they were innocent and claimed the victims attended school on August 14 and participated in the Independence Day celebration on August 15 accompanied by parents, and during the same period, no complaints or rievances about the August 13 incident were reported. The applicants claimed the victims appeared to be in good health, showing no signs of distress. The applicants also argued that there was a significant delay in filing FIR and carrying out medical examinations. They argued that there was no need to recover any documents

or evidence from the applicants.

However, Public Prosecutor Hiten Venegaonkar, representing the police, argued that the offence in question was serious and that applicants were responsible for the school's management and had an obligation to report the incident after their guardians approached the

After perusing past Supreme Court judgements, the court noted that the legislature has imposed an obligation on individuals who are either suspect or aware of offences under the Pocso Act to report the incident to Special Juvenile Police or local police and such a duty cannot be overlooked. "Interpretations of failing to report such incidents are serious," the bench noted. Justice Laddha observed prima facie material indicating that the guardians voiced their concerns to the principal and other staff members and applicants were aware of it before August 16 when the police contacted them. "Despite having knowledge the incidents were not reported to SJP or local police. This delay appears to be primarily due to applicants' negligence for reasons known only to them. Dean of Mumbai's Nair Hospital transferred amid sexual harassment allegations against faculty member

Dr Sudhir Medhekar, Dean of Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation-run Topiwala National Medical College and Hospital in Mumbai, commonly known as Nair Hospital, was transferred following allegations of sexual harassment against a senior faculty member. Meanwhile, Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has assured strict action against the accused and said justice will be served to the victims. Shinde directed Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) Commissioner Bhuvan Gaggarani to facilitate the immediate transfer of the dean. A special inquiry committee will also be established to conduct a thorough investigation, said an official. The Chief Minister has also mandated additional measures to ensure the safety of the staff and students at the hospital.

Shinde in a statement said, "Such incidents in the healthcare sector are extremely serious. We will investigate this case and take strict action against those responsible. It is our duty to create a safe environment for everyone in the hospital."The allegations came to light in March when an MBBS student at the Nair Hospital lodged a complaint against a senior faculty member, accusing him of inappropriate conduct during what was purported to be a medical examination. The hospital's Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) committee conducted an investigation and deemed the student's complaint credible. The committee recommended that the accused faculty member be transferred from the hospital until the student completes her studies and criticized the hospital administration's handling of the situation, labelling it as "insensitive" to the student's distress. The POSH committee also reprimanded another faculty member who had testified in favour of the accused, allegedly attempting to shield him. This faculty member was ordered to undergo counselling. Furthermore, the committee recommended that the accused be barred from evaluating the student in future examinations and suggested withholding his salary increments for a year. Dr Medhekar said that after being informed, the accused was removed from teaching duties and reassigned to administrative tasks. Dr Medhekar

Coaching centre owner shot at in Pune's Indapur over political rivalry, two arrested

A 30-year-old man running a coaching centre for competitive exams was allegedly shot at four times by a 19-year-old assailant in Pune's Indapur on Monday night in a fallout of local political rivalry. The police said the victim was critical but stable and that they arrested two suspects, including the assailant. The shooting took place around 7 pm in front of the Indapur College of Arts, Science and Commerce. The victim has been identified as Rahul Chavan. The assailant has been identified as Abhijit Chormale and his accomplice as Prakash Shinde, 50.

"Initial probe suggests that Chavan and Chormale's family has a past rivalry over local politics. In 2021, these two sides had registered cases against each other over a dispute during local elections. Probe suggests that the attempt to murder Chavan was a fallout of that dispute," said Pankaj Deshmukh, Superintendent of Police, Pune Rural police. Deshmukh added, "Chavan has named nine persons in the FIR. We have arrested two and are probing the role of others." An officer from Indapur police station said, "The CCTV footage from the location shows Chormale opening fire at Chavan from behind. Chavan sustained four bullet injuries, after which Chormale fled on his bike. Chavan was rushed to a local hospital, where he is being treated. His condition is critical but stable."

Couple cheated by middlemen on pretext of job in SCCL, ends life

Congress leader Jagdish Tytler seeks quashing of charges, pleads alibi

While hearing Congress leader Jagdish Tytler's plea to quash a trial court's order framing charges against him in a 1984 ant-Sikh riots case, the Delhi High Court on Tuesday called for the statement of a witness who has made contrary depositions over the years.

The case pertains to the deaths of three men when a mob set fire to the Pul Bangash Gurdwara in Delhi during the anti-Sikh riots of 1984. On August 30, a Rouse Avenue court framed charges against Tytler in the CBI case under several sections of the Indian Penal Code, including 302 (murder), 109 (abetment), 147 (rioting), 153A

(promoting enmity between groups), and 143 (unlawful assembly). Before Justice Manoj Ohri, Tytler's counsel submitted that the FIR in the case was first registered on November 1, 1984, leading to the chargesheeting of 31 individuals, all of whom were subsequently acquitted. A supplementary chargesheet was filed later, in which Tytler was not named as an accused, and a third chargesheet was submitted on June 2, 2023, alleging abetment. The counsel pointed to prosecution documents and said that Tytler's presence at Teen Murti Bhavan in Safdarjung on the day of the incident was evident from Doordarshan footage. "The trial court refuses to look into the Doordarshan footage on the ground that this is my defence and alibi to be considered at the stage of trial but he (trial court) forgets that this is not being provided by me, it is in the prosecution papers. It's absurdity.... either you say this Doordarshan footage is false... At the end of the day, three new witnesses have cropped up. Harpal Kaur, Harvinderjit Singh and Abdul Wahid. These witnesses have come into picture in 2016 and 2023," the Congress leader's counsel said. Tytler contends that of the three witnesses the CBI is relying on, Harpal Kaur previously testified in 2008 that she had not seen Tytler inciting any mob at the site of the incident. The court has scheduled the matter for further consideration on Novem-

After Siddaramaiah's wife decides to surrender MUDA sites, BJP asks if theft can be forgiven after return of stolen goods

Hours after Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's wife B M Parvathi said she would surrender the sites allotted to her by the Mysuru Urban Development Authority (MUDA), Karnataka BJP on Tuesday took a dig at the CM asking whether a thief becomes innocent as soon as he returns the stolen goods. Siddaramaiah, meanwhile, said he respected his wife's decision and rued that she had to suffer mental harassment due to the political vendetta pursued against him. Parvathi decided to surrender the 14 sites allotted to her in Mysuru after the Enforcement Directorate booked Siddaramaiah in connection with the MUDA case. Reacting to this, Leader of Opposition R Ashoka said the decision was a victory to the party's struggle against alleged irregularities at MUDA. "As the noose of law tightened in the Muda scam, CM Siddaramaiah has decided to return the 14 sites he had acquired in his wife's name.. and the fact that those who said they have done nothing wrong have now admitted their mistake and surrendered to the truth is another victory in the path of our struggle," Ashoka said Tuesday. "Is

the theft forgiven as soon as the goods are returned?" he asked in Kannada in a post on X.By returning the sites, Ashoka said, Siddaramaiah is admitting that there has been some mistake. "The decision to surrender the sites is a political drama," he said.

BJP state president B Y Vijayendra asked whether Siddaramaiah's wife had voluntarily decided to surrender the sites or whether she was forced to do so. "CM Siddaramaiah was saying that he had not committed any mistake and the allegations were politically motivated. He had asked why he should surrender the sites," he said during a press conference. On his part, Siddaramaiah said people of the state know that Opposition parties created a false complaint and dragged his family into the row. "My stand was to fight against it without bowing down to the injustice. My wife, who is hurt by the political conspiracy against me, has surprised me by deciding to surrender the sites. Yet, I respect her decision to surrender the sites," he said. For the first time in Maharashtra, Mumbai's Sydenham College of Commerce and Economics has started a unique course. Bachelors in Luxury Brand and Retail Management (LBRM). This undergraduate degree course is a customised programme to cater to the increasing luxury market in India. Admissions have opened from the academic year 2024-25.

The LBRM is a course offered under the Homi Bhabha State University (HBSU), one of the firsts cluster universities in the city formed by combining four government-run colleges, including the Sydenham college. The course offers specialisations in luxury sectors such as gems and jewellery, apparel and fashion, beauty and wellness among all. Students having passed their Class XII exams are eligible to apply for this course but will have to secure admission through the entrance procedure which includes tests and interviews.

This is among the first few academic initiatives taken by the college after coming out of the Mumbai University's ambit. Principal of the college, Dr Shrinivas Dhure, explained, "The idea is to offer industry related courses in order to increase employability of our students." Dhure added, "This was conveniently possible because we are now part of a separate university with fewer colleges to govern, which is making it more effective. Thanks to the academic freedom, we are able to offer such a unique course. The course is already seeing a high demand." Dhure said the course began with 30 seats and during the admissions process, 15 more seats were added considering the huge demand. An official of the college confirmed admissions from applicants across the coun-

The LBRM course is a result of an initiative by 2002 alumnus of the college Dhaval Gandhi who now runs a successful coaching institute. As someone from the field of academics, Gandhi wanted to give back to his Alma Mater in a unique way and decided to offer his expertise to his college and jointly founded The School of Luxury Retail Management at the Sydenham College. The course includes a modern classroom and other sections created with support from alumni donations. Gandhi said the course has many industry stalwarts from luxury brands as teachers for master classes and to ensure good industry exposure to students. Gandhi is also associated with the school as the chief mentor to oversee its functioning. He said, "It is one thing to provide financial support to one's Alma Mater but considering my background in academics, I wanted to take it ahead and provide a unique opportunity to the students in Mumbai. The luxury market in India is growing but there is no trained manpower to work in this increasing industry sector. Currently, students have to depend on such niche courses offered

Osho followers in Pune deny UK woman's rape charges: 'baseless and have no truth whatsoever'

(File Photo)In an interview with The Times, the UK-based newspaper, the 54year-old woman has alleged she was forced to engage in sexual activities from the age of seven after her mother was drawn to the cult. After a British woman alleged she was raped over 50 times in Osho ashrams across the world in the 1970s, the controversial guru's close associates denied the charges on Tuesday and said children were not allowed inside the ashram located in upscale Koregaon Park area of Pune city.

In an interview with The Times, the UK-based newspaper, the 54-year-old woman has alleged she was forced to engage in sexual activities from the age of seven after her mother was drawn to the cult. The woman also alleged that between the age of 7 and 11, she and her friends were coerced into performing sexual acts on adult men living in the ashram before these escalated to rape.A documentary, Children of the Cult, made by Maroesja Perizonius is also based on the woman's allegations against the Osho ashrams. "If these allegations also pertain to the ashram in Pune of the 70s, then they seem to have been made with an intention to make money...They are baseless and have no truth whatsoever so far as Pune's Osho ashram of the 70s is concerned...This is because children were never allowed inside the ashram except for once during lunch break," Swami Chaitanya Keerti, a close associate of Osho who joined the ashram in 1974 and was with him for at least 15 years, told The Indian Express.Swami Chaitanya Keerti — who has been ousted from Osho International Meditation Resort, a new name given to the Osho ashram, and now heads the 'Rebel Sannyansins' group - also served as the editor of Osho Times.

Ma Amrit Sadhana, spokesperson for Osho International Meditation Resort, said, "The 21 members who run



the Resort have collectively decided not to respond to the allegations as the Resort has nothing to do with them". Keerti said children were not allowed to stay at the Pune ashram so the question of their sexual exploitation cannot arise. "Only parents could come inside the ashram and participate in the meditation and commune activities whole day, and children could come during lunch hour only," he added. Keerti said he does not recall seeing the woman, then a seven-year-old or her mother. "There used to be 2,000-3000 sannyasins at any given point of time," he said. "Some groups of Christian fundamentalists have become very active again to malign Osho's name, making movies, writing books, and using paid media for their sinister conspiracies against Osho. Such people have a history of funding the media projects against Osho," said Keerti. "After the Wild Wild Country on Netflix, there was a vacuum of six years to spread negativity against Osho. And now this vacuum will be filled by the Children of the Cult documentary, the salacious fiction based on the life of the UK girl. She would earn a huge amount of money and fame with this project," he alleged. "The woman knows that sex stories have enormous potential to reach all corners of the earth, and Osho's name with it and huge success is yours for sure. In the sex-starved world, fabricated sex stories sell with speed. What a world of perverts people keep living today! And the modern media plays an important role in serving this world," he added.

Who is Birendranath Sircar? With Mithun Chakraborty's Dadasaheb Phalke win, a look at the 13 Bengali superstars who precede

From Birendranath Sircar, Pankaj Mullick, and Kanan Devi in the 70s to Satyajit Ray, Mrinal Sen, Manna De, and Soumitra Chattopadhyay — Mithun Chakraborty's 2024 win of the Dadasaheb Phalke award is preceded by several of West Bengal's film megastars. Presented annually by the Directorate of Film Festivals, the award is India's highest honour in cinema, established in 1969.Birendranath Sircar founded the studio New Theatres Calcutta in Tollygunge in 1930. Forty years later, he became the first Bengali and second person to win the Dadasaheb Phalke award. By that time, his studio had attracted directors such as P C Barua, Premankur Atorthy, Debaki Bose, Dhirendra Nath Ganguly, Bimal Roy and

Pankaj Mullick, who received the award in 1972, was one of the pioneers of Indian film music in his time. Besides being a composer and singer, Mullick was also an actor, a playwright, a writer, a teacher, and an administrator. His career at All India Radio spanned 50 years, while his career in Indian films was spread over 38 years. At AIR, Pankaj Mullick set music to the immortal Mahishasuramardini, a programme that has become a part of Bengali culture and synonymous with Durga Puja. It is heard every Mahalaya morning to this date, with an uninterrupted run since it began in 1931. Dhirendra Nath Ganguly was an actor, entrepreneur, and director. He and Madan Theatres' manager Nitish Lahiri formed the first Bengali-owned film production company, Indo British Film Co. Later, he formed the Lotus Film Company, British Dominion Films, and other production companies. He received the award just three years after Mullick, in 1975. Actress and singer Kanan Devi, the highest-paid actress of her time, had shot to fame while working with Radha Film Company, winning the award in 1976. Devi made her debut as a child actress in the film Joydev (1926). She worked in a total of 57 films, and she sang around 40 songs. In Hindi cinema, Devi also worked with veteran actors KL Sehgal, Pankaj Malik, Prathamesh Barua, Pahari Sanyal, Chhabi Biswas, and Ashok Kumar.In 1977, the award was won by Nitin Bose, a film director, cinematographer, and screenwriter who made both Bengali and Hindi films. He has also worked with Sircar's New Theatres Calcutta. The first use of playback singing in Indian films occurred in films directed by Bose — in Bhagya Chakra, a 1935 Bengali film, and later in the same year its Hindi remake, Dhoop Chhaon. His most well-known work is Ganga Jamuna. Satyajit Ray, a future winner, was a nephew of Bose and worked under him in the movie Mashaal (1950).

Raichand Boral received the Dadasaheb Phalke Award in 1978. He was known as the father of Indian film music. His famous films were Puran Bhagat, Chandidas, Dhoop Chhaon, Manzil, Anath Ashram, Vidyapati, President, Abhaagan, Jawani ki Reet, Sapera, Haar Jeet, Lagan, Saugand, Wapas and Wasiat Nama. Anjangarh (1948) was his last film with New Theatres. He was the music director for Bose's Dhoop Chhaon. Satyajit Ray, who won the national award in 1984, figures among the world's favourite filmmakers. He is the only Indian filmmaker thus far who won an Oscar for lifetime achievement in cinema. He was also a music composer, writer, screenplay writer, documentary filmmaker, lyricist, illustrator, magazine editor, and many more. Ray first saw global recognition through his film Pather Panchali (1955) which received a major award at the 1956 Cannes International Film Festival.Born in then-undivided Bengal in Bhagalpur, Ashok Kumar was one of the most popular actors of Bollywood in the sixties, receiving the award in 1988. Kumar's film career continued throughout the sixties and the seventies in productions like Aansoo Ban Gaye Phool (1969), Pakeezah (1972), and Phool Khile Hain Gulshan Gulshan (1978). He also appeared in the foreign Tumhare Liye (1978) with Sanjeev Kumar.

In 1999, Hrishikesh Mukherjee won. A director, editor, and writer, he is considered one of the greatest directors of Indian cinema. He is known for a number of films, including Anari, Satyakam, Chupke Chupke, Anupama, Anand, Abhimaan, Guddi, Gol Maal, Bawarchi, Khubsoorat and Namak Haraam. Mrinal Sen won in 2003, having started his career in 1969 with a comedy, Bhuvan Shome — going on to win several national and international awards. Writer Rabindranath Tagore was a great source of inspiration to Tapan Sinha, who won the award in 2006. Sinha was a renowned Bengali film director who was influenced by American and British filmmaking. He made three films on Tagore's stories: Kabuliwala, Khudito Pashan, and Atithi. Sinha was followed a year later by Manna Dey (2007), a renowned playback singer, music director and composer of Hindi films as well as Bengali cinema. For almost fifty years, he did playback singing for popular Hindi films, featuring in big names like Sholay, Mera Naam Joker, Anand and several other films. Finally, Soumitra Chattopadhyay was the last Bengali to win the Dadasaheb Award in 2011, over a decade before Mithun Chakraborty's win. Chattopadhyay was known for his collaborations with Oscar-winning film director Satyajit Ray, with whom he worked on fourteen films. He began his film career in 1959 with Satyajit Ray's film Apur



An Amazon-like platform for fruits and vegetables to bring farmers close to consumers

GNS News Agency, Oct 4Yogesh Kedari, a gradu ate in horticulture and an MBA in Agriculture Business Management, had noticed the curiously long journey that farm produce takes from the field to consumer. "Imagine a farmer in Himachal Pradesh. He will send the produce to somebody sitting in the capital city, Shimla, who will transport it to Chandigarh, before the produce moves to Delhi and is sold by somebody else in the distribution market, like Bengaluru. From here, the produce will make its way to a small town kirana store. This is a very long value chain," says Kedari.

After working in the space for 19 years, during which he became convinced that there was a disconnect between buyers and farmers because of multiple intermediaries, Kedari took the plunge in 2023 with a startup, Mulyam Agronomics , which is based in Pune-Chinchwad.Mulyam's solution was to directly buy all grades of fruits and vegetables from farmers and Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs). The farmers, now dealing with a single entity that offers fair prices, get better returns on their produce, a market all over India and logistics and packaging assistance. The products are, then, delivered at a fast pace to wholesalers, retailers, exporters and other institutional buyers across the country, thus opening up distant markets for the products. It is the small, Tier-II and III wholesale buyers that Mulyam is especially targetting. At present, Mulyam has more of a transactional relationship with wholesalers and institutional buyers. In the next six months, it is going to launch a full-fledged B2B marketplace. "We are trying to bring our capability to a level where we can scale. Once we operate on a scale of say one lakh or two lakh metric tons of fresh produce, we want to run the business as a platform that will have



suppliers coming on the platform and buyers purchasing through us. This will enable farmers to sell their produce across the country in their brand and buyers across regions to access the produce," says Kedari, emphasising that they want to create an FPO marketplace for market linkage. The services will include value additions such as logistics and packaging platforms. "Once we introduce the platform, we will not take a trading cut but a service charge," says Kedari. He says that buyers will get consistent supply, better quality and financing solutions. Farmers get a pan-India reach, help in procurement of packaging material, better logistics rates and prices across all the major and smaller markets in the country. "This will enable farmers to go beyond their current reach of 50-100 km radius that he sells. The best thing is that FPOs can create their brand and showcase across the country in wholesale markets through us," says Kedari.

For raising 'anti-national slogans', police book unknown persons at Kolkata protest against R G Kar rape and murder

An FIR was lodged at Kolkata's Patuli police station against unknown individuals for allegedly raising "antinational" slogans during a protest rally on September 29. The slogan "Kashmir mange azadi (Kashmir wants freedom)" was purportedly chanted during the rally, which was organised to demand justice for a trainee doctor who was found raped and murdered at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in August.

The case has been registered under sections 152 (acts endangering the sovereignty, unity, and integrity of India), 285 (danger or obstruction in public way or line of navigation), and 3(5) (establishes joint criminal liability when two or more individuals act with a common intention) of the BNS. The incident sparked outrage after Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Keya Ghosh shared a purported video on X of people shouting the slogans at the rally. "Whose conspiracy is trying to disrupt the movement with these two-five people?" she wrote on Sunday.On the same day, BJP leader Dilip Ghosh



claimed that the rally took place in Jadavpur on his social media handle. He wrote that "instead of demanding (CM Mamata Banerjee's) resignation, (the protestors in the video) are diverting attention from the real issue."" You won't be able to understand when anti-national slogans demanding " #Azadi "(freedom) arise from a protest, march, or movement seeking justice for Abhaya and other such causes! In Jadavpur, during one such protest, slogans for Azadi were raised," he wrote.

Viagogo, BookMyShow and Coldplay tickets controversy: 'Not linked to BookMyShow, fully compliant with Indian Law's says Viagogo

While the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Mumbai police has summoned top officials of Big Tree Entertainment Private Limited, the parent of BookMyShow, amid the black ticketing controversy surrounding tickets of Coldplay concert, Viagogo — one of the key platforms where Coldplay concert tickets are being sold at prices quoting several times the original — has denied any association with BookMyShow. Viagogo further said that it is simply a marketplace where individuals can come and resell their tickets. "Viagogo is not working with BookMyShow," the official spokesperson told The Indian Express over an email exchange, adding that "tickets listed on Viagogo come from a range of sources, including multinational event organisers, corporate ticket holders, season ticket holders, sponsors and fans who simply can no longer attend an event."

Founded in 2006 by Eric Baker, Viagogo operates as a secondary marketplace, where individuals can resell tickets for live events such as sports, music, and theatre. The platform emphasises that it does not sell tickets or set prices but allows sellers to do so independently. The controversy erupted when millions of fans eagerly waiting to see the iconic British band Coldplay - known for classics like 'Yellow', 'Fix You', 'Paradise', and more recently 'Something Just Like This' — were abruptly logged out last Sunday noon (September 22) as tickets went on sale. After repeated attempts to log back in, fans found themselves stuck in long virtual queues, with hundreds of thousands ahead of them, leading to frustration and disappointment. What fuelled this frustration into anger was the sudden appearance of tickets on third-party platforms like Viagogo, being sold at exorbitant markups. For instance, a ticket in H row of section 2D, originally priced at ?12,500 on BookMyShow, was listed for ?68,033 and even as high as ?337,823 on separate listings.

Social media exploded with outrage, as fans speculated about possible collusion between the platforms. The situation escalated to legal action when Mumbai-based lawyer Amit Vyas filed a complaint against BookMyShow and the event promoters, accusing them of black-marketing tickets. In the wake of significant backlash on social media, which carried through from Sunday to Monday and Tuesday, BookMyShow released a statement on Tuesday distancing itself from Viagogo, Gigsberg, and other third-party platforms reselling tickets. They condemned ticket scalping, clarified that they had filed a police complaint, and urged fans "not to fall victim to these scams," warning that tickets "bought from unauthorised sources will be at the risk of the consumer, and can turn out to be fake tickets."Responding to questions about scalping and compliance with Indian law, the Viagogo spokesperson told The Ithat their "platform is fully compliant with Indian law - as it is in all markets in which it operates". "Viagogo takes its obligations under law very seriously. When we are contacted by any relevant au-



thority in respect of any investigation, Viagogo cooperates fully and fulfils its legal obligations," it added.Regarding inflated ticket prices, Viagogo reiterated that sellers set their own prices, which reflect demand. "Prices can change and tend to reduce over time, so we recommend fans wait for demand to settle," the spokesperson said, noting that overly inflated prices rarely sell. They opposed price caps, arguing that such limits drive sellers to unregulated markets where fans may lack protection. "Ultimately, ticket resale prices are driven by supply and demand. Our goal is to provide a safe space where fans can buy and sell tickets, protected by a guarantee," it added. When Viagogo was asked if they will be making any changes to their policies or practices in response to the recent scrutiny and complaints regarding ticket sales and pricing, it said, "Viagogo continues to innovate and develop to provide the best platform for our users. Any changes to our platform will be tailored towards those users to ensure they receive the best experience and are able to buy tickets to the live events they love.""We exist to get fans into once-in-a-lifetime live events like Coldplay. To back that up we provide a guarantee that ensures fans receive their tickets in time for the event and in the rare instance of an issue, replacement tickets or their money back," it concluded.

Indo-Canadian mediaperson, attacked by two persons, blames 'pro-Khalistan' elements

A spokesperson for Calgary Police told Red FM that the arrested pair had been identified as Gursewak Singh and Sukhpreet Singh. The former was charged pointing a firearm, unauthorised possession of a firearm, possession of a prohibited or restricted firearm, possession of a weapon dangerous to the public, contravention of the Firearms Act, threats to cause death or bodily harm, while the latter also face the same counts except pointing a firearm. The attack on Nagar occurred on Sunday after he was leaving an election-related event in the North East quadrant of the city. "When I came out of the event and was moving towards my car, they attacked unprovoked. My left eye is damaged, right leg is injured," he said. He said that earlier an associate of the attackers contacted him for the appointment for a meeting on Thursday. The outlet CBC News cited Calgary Police as stating it is investigating the attack and looking for two suspects. The attack was captured on CCTV camera. Staff Sergeant John

Guigon told the outlet police was "throwing resources at" the investigation while describing the assault as "particularly troubling to us when a member of the media gets attacked in a democracy". There have been unconfirmed allegations of an attempt by pro-Khalistan elements to extort funds from the Calgary gurdwara, though the Hindustan Times could not substantiate them. What are countries doing to get nationals out of Lebanon?

Western nations are updating contingency plans for organising evacuations from Lebanon after a sharp escalation in border warfare between Israel and the Lebanese armed movement Hezbollah. Cyprus, the closest European Union member state to the Middle East, is a likely hub, having processed around 60,000 people fleeing the Hezbollah-Israel war in 2006. No country has activated a large-scale military evacuation yet, though some are chartering aircraft to assist in their nationals leaving as Beirut airport remains open. There have also been plans to evacuate by sea to Cyprus, enabling the movement of larger groups of people at a time. Here are details on contingency planning:

AUSTRALIAAuthorities have made contingency plans that could include evacuation by sea, though it has urged an estimated 15,000 of its citizens in Lebanon to leave while Beirut airport remains open.CANADANews reports from Canada suggest it will cooperate with Australia in evacuating nationals by sea. The plan involves contracting a commercial vessel to transport 1,000 people out each day, The Toronto Star reported.

FRANCEFrance, which has been urging citizens not to travel to Lebanon, has had evacuation plans in place

for several months but has not issued an evacuation order. Present contingency plans centre around Cyprus and Beirut airport, while it is also discussing evacuations via Turkey. France has a warship in the region, while a French helicopter carrier will arrive in the eastern Mediterranean in the coming days and take up position in case a decision is taken to evacuate foreign nationals from Lebanon, a French army spokesperson said on Tuesday.GERMANYGermany has evacuated non-essential staff, families of embassy workers and German nationals who are medically vulnerable out of Lebanon and will support others trying to leave, a joint statement by the foreign and defence ministries said on Monday. Germans in the region can leave the country on commercial flights via airports that are still open, a spokesperson for the German foreign ministry said on Monday.GREECEThe Greek foreign ministry has urged its citizens to leave Lebanon and avoid any travel to the country. A frigate is on standby in case assistance is needed.UNITED KINGDOMBritain has called for its nationals to leave immediately. It has moved around 700 troops to Cyprus, bolstering its presence in the area where it already has military assets, including two Royal Navy ships. It also has two military bases on the island. The British government has chartered a flight to help meet any additional demand from Britons wishing to leave on Wednesday, and will fly directly back to London.

ITALYItaly has reduced unnecessary diplomatic staff and beefed up security personnel at its embassy in Beirut, a source told Reuters. Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani has repeatedly urged nationals to leave the country and sought assurances from Israel over the safety of Italian soldiers operating in peacekeeping operations in the area.UNITED STATESThe U.S. has ordered the deployment of dozens of troops to Cyprus to help prepare for scenarios, including an evacuation of Americans from Lebanon.PORTUGALPrime Minister Luis Montenegro has advised against travel to Lebanon. The country assisted in the evacuation of a small number of Portuguese citizens living there.

China marks 75 years of Communist Party rule as economic challenges and security threats linger

China is marking the 75th year of Communist Party rule as economic challenges and security threats linger over the massive state. No festivities have been announced for the occasion on Tuesday, save for a flagraising ceremony at Tiananmen Square, with an honor guard marching from the entrance of the sprawling palace that in past centuries was the home of Chinese emperors. The entirely state-controlled media ran constant reports on China's economic progress and social stability, with no mention of challenges ranging from a declining birth rate to the disruption in supply chains that has the largely export-driven economy. Commemorations were also held in the former British colony of Hong Kong and Portugal's former territory of Macao, both of which returned to Chinese sovereignty in the late 1990s in a key indication of Beijing's determination to overcome what it has called a "Century

of Humiliation."In recent decades, China has mounted

might only at the turn of decades, such as for the 60th and

The world's second largest economy has struggled to regain momentum after the COVID-19 pandemic. A prolonged property slump led to a spillover effect on other parts of the economy, fr appliances. Last week, China announced a slew of measures to boost the economy, including lower interest rates and smaller down payment requirements for mortgages.Party leader and head of state Xi Jinping has largely avoided overseas travel since the pandemic, while continuing with his purges at home of top officials considered insufficiently loyal or being suspected of corruption or personal indiscretions."The road ahead will not be smooth, there will definitely be difficulties and obstacles, and we may encounter major tests such as high winds and rough seas, or even stormy waves" Mr. Xi warned during a banquet on the eve of the anniversary.

and rely closely on the entire Party, the entire army, and people of all ethnic groups across the country" he said, "no difficulties can stop the Chinese people from moving forward."The anniversary also comes as China is facing growing frictions with neighbors including Japan, South Korea and the Philippines over territorial claims and their close relationships with Beijing's chief rival, the United States. The Communists under Mao Zedong seized power in 1949 amid a civil war with the Nationalists, also known as the KMT, led by Chiang Kai-shek, who shifted their political, economic and military power to the now selfgoverning island democracy of Taiwan. Beijing continues to insist Taiwan must be annexed under Communist Party rule, by force if necessary, while the U.S. has provided arms to ensure its defense. China, meanwhile, has involved itself in disputes over its claims to most of the South China Sea and uninhabited islands held by Japan, the Philippines, Vietnam and other neighboring nations. China's military buildup and its recent launch of a nuclear capable ballistic missile into the Pacific Ocean have raised concerns about a possible conflict. At home, Mr. Xi has made himself effectively leader for life by ending term limits and extending his power over key government and party bodies. China allows no competitive elections and the party retains near total control over the media that informs its 1.4 billion people.

IMF team to arrive for talks with new Lanka government on loan agreement for economic recovery

The global lender said it will discuss the timing of the third

review of its ongoing economic reform under a 48-month loan. Former president Ranil Wickremesinghe-led government was negotiating with the IMF for the release of the fourth tranche of the \$2.9 billion facility. "A high-level team led by Krishna Srinivasan, Director for the Asia Pacific Department will be visiting Colombo October 2-4 to meet with President Dissanayake and the new economic team to discuss the latest economic developments and economic reforms under Sri Lanka's economic programme supported by the IMF," a release said.

This will be the National People's Power (NPP) government's first interaction with the international lender after being elected on September 21. On September 23, Mr. Dissanayake was sworn in as Sri Lanka's ninth president, amid hopes that he will bolster the country's economy and eliminate corruption.Mr. Dissanayake, the leader of the Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna party's broader front National People's Power (NPP), defeated his closest rival Sajith Premadasa of Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) in the presidential election.Mr. Dissananayake's JVP-led NPP has pledged to renegotiate the IMF deal citing it has

led to some unbearable difficulties for common people. The meeting would be crucial to negotiating with the IMF for the release of the fourth tranche of the \$2.9 billion facility. The third review and the release of the fourth tranche were put back due to the election. Originally, the fourth tranche was scheduled for December this year after the completion of the third review. Ahead of the IMF visit, the government policymakers on Monday (September 30, 2024) said the plan to restructure the national carrier Srilankan Airlines has been abandoned. There has been no official statement though. The airline restructuring figured in the IMF's governance diagnostic report concerning the loss-making state-owned enterprises.In July, the Wickremesinghe government said it had scrapped its plan to sell the airline despite shortlisting three potential partners.

TAFE files for contempt against AGCO after US co terminates Massey Ferguson licence deal



TAFE, TAFE contempt against AGCO, United States, Massey Ferguson licence deal, tractor brand ownership, shareholders, Indian express newsTAFE and AGCO had locked horns over Massey Ferguson, with the former claiming ownership of the popular tractor brand in India. Indian tractor major Tractors and Farm Equipment (TAFE) Monday filed a contempt petition against its long-term partner AGCO Corporation, the US-based agricultural equipment manufacturer, after the latter delivered immediate termination notices for its agreements with TAFE, including the brand licence for the popular Massey Ferguson tractors.

TAFE, India's second-largest tractor manufacturer led by Mallika Srinivasan, is the largest shareholder in the \$14.4-billion US company with a share of 16.3 per cent. TAFE had acquired the stake in 2012, and became its single largest shareholder and strategic long-term investor. AGCO's other top shareholders include institutional investors including Vanguard and Blackrock. The top 10 shareholders have a cumulative stake of 52.8 per cent in AGCO.In a statement, TAFE said the Commercial Court in Chennai had ruled in its favour with an interim status quo order with respect to the Massey Ferguson brand. Claiming it was impermissible for either party (TAFE or AGCO) to disturb the position as on April 29, 2024, it said, "TAFE has filed a petition against AGCO for disobedience of the orders of the court in a contempt petition in Chennai.

The Indian company has asserted its claims over the ownership of the Massey Ferguson brand in a case filed before the Madras High Court. "Since its inception in 1960, TAFE has produced, built and nurtured the Massey Ferguson brand...With a total annual production of over 180,000 tractors, over 100,000 Massey Ferguson are produced by TAFE in India with over 3 Million satisfied customers in its fold. TAFE and Massey Ferguson are synonymous in India...AGCO's global brand website has historically for six decades made no mention of Massey Ferguson in the context of India, Nepal and Bhutan having ceded the entire territory to TAFE since the take-over of Massey Ferguson India in 1960," TAFE said.

The TAFE statement came after AGCO delivered termination notices of its Massey Ferguson brand licence agreement with TAFE, distributor agreement with TAFE for the markets of India, Nepal and Bhutan, and intellectual property licence agreement with TAFE for the markets of India, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Bhutan. In a press release, AGCO said Monday that it has "also commenced legal proceedings against TAFE in India related to the use of the Massey Ferguson brand following the termination of these notices."TAFE and AGCO had locked horns over Massey Ferguson, with the former claiming ownership of the popular tractor brand in India. TAFE has also accused AGCO's management of pushing back against the Indian company's growing influence at the latter, sought changes in AGCO's board and a split of the position of chairman and chief executive officer, which is currently held by Eric Hansotia. On Monday, TAFE also wrote a public letter to AGCO's shareholders, in which it accused the AGCO management of "ignoring" its suggestions for improving the corporation's business performance. "As the Company (AGCO) has struggled in recent years to integrate acquisitions and expand into new markets, we have drawn on our experience to provide leadership with pragmatic suggestions. Unfortunately, AGCO has responded by ignoring these ideas, taking measures to disenfranchise TAFE, and isolating our representative on the Board...," TAFE said in its letter to AGCO shareholders.TAFE alleged that AGCO's current state was such that despite being a long-term, strategic investor with no history of public activism, the Indian company felt "compelled" to air its concerns publicly. Calling for "shareholder-driven boardroom change" at AGCO, TAFE told the shareholders: "AGCO's issues have also led us to begin assessing the ways in which a strategic transformation can be implemented, with new and independent directors who possess the expertise required

Survey: Manufacturing industries' job growth at 12-year high in FY23


The Annual Survey of Industries (ASI) for 2022-23, released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) Monday, showed that the total number of employees in manufacturing industries increased by 7.5 per cent to 1.84 crore in 2022-23 from 1.72 crore in 2021-22. This is the highest rate of increase in employment in manufacturing industries in the last 12 years.

The highest employment was recorded in factories producing food products, followed by textiles, basic metals, wearing apparel and motor vehicles, trailers and semitrailers, the latest ASI data showed. According to the survey, the total number of factories increased from 2.49 lakh in 2021-22 to 2.53 lakh in 2022-23, which was the first year marking the full recovery phase after the Covid-19 pandemic.In comparison, the number of workers employed in the informal sector in 2022-23 had dropped by 16.45 lakh or about 1.5 per cent to 10.96 crore compared to 11.13 crore in 2015-16, as per the Annual Survey of Unincorporated Enterprises (ASUSE) 2022-23 released in July this year.rAt a press briefing on the ASI data release, NITI Aayog CEO BVR Subrahmanyam said it suggests the impact of the Covid pandemic has been "wiped out". Survey: Manufacturing industries' job growth at 12year high in FY23"What this data is showing is that we have now overcome the Covid shock and the manufacturing sector is now on the upswing and that's very clear. These figures are coming as a surprise to us also," he said. The ASI data is the principal source of industrial statistics and data for organised manufacturing. It relates to factories employing 10 or more workers using power and those employing 20 or more workers without using power. The definition is slightly tweaked for states of Maharashtra. Rajasthan and Goa, wherein data is collected for factories employing 20 or more workers with power and factories having 40 or more workers without power. The survey also covers registered bidi and cigar manufacturing

The Ministry said the main drivers of the manufacturing growth in 2022-23 were industries related to basic metal, coke & refined petroleum products, food products, chemical and chemical products and motor vehicles. "These industries, taken together, contributed about 58% of the total output of the sector and showed output growth of 24.5% and GVA growth of 2.6% in comparison to 2021-22," the Ministry said in a statement.

The estimated number of persons engaged in the manufacturing industries in 2022-23 is higher than the pre-pandemic level of 2018-19 by over 22.14 lakh, the Ministry said. The average emoluments also improved in 2022-23, with average emoluments per person rising by 6.3 per cent in 2022-23 as against the previous year. In terms of GVA, Maharashtra ranked first in 2022-23 followed by Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh. These top five states together contributed more than 54 per cent of the total manufacturing GVA of the country in 2022-23. In terms of employment also, the top five states were Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh and Karnataka in ASI 2022-23, contributing about 55 per cent of total manufacturing employment in 2022-23

Workers include all persons employed directly or through any agency and includes both paid and unpaid workers engaged in any manufacturing process or in cleaning any part of the machinery or the manufacturing premises. Employees include all workers and persons receiving wages and holding clerical or supervisory or managerial positions along with those engaged in purchase of raw materials or fixed assets for the factory as well as watch and ward staff. Gross fixed capital formation, a proxy for capital investment, grew by over 77 per cent to Rs 5.85 lakh crore in 2022-23 from Rs 3.3 lakh crore in 2021-22. Net fixed capital formation, which is derived after removing depreciation, grew by 781.6 per cent to Rs 2.68 lakh crore. Profits in the manufacturing sector grew by 2.7 per cent to Rs 9.76 lakh crore. Fixed capital investments had taken a sharp hit during the pandemic affected years. Gross fixed capital formation had declined by 11 per cent in 2021-22 to Rs 3.30 lakh crore



from Rs 4.17 lakh crore in the pre-pandemic year of 2019 20.In 2022-23, however, the addition in stock of materials, fuels and semi-finished goods contracted by over 50 per cent, while addition in stock of finished goods decreased by 36.1 per cent. Subrahmanyam added that when these numbers are extrapolated to a 7.5 per cent per annum GDP growth rate, the share of manufacturing in GDP and in employment will also rise. "I am sure in the next two months, when (GDP) data comes out this year, you will see a lot of people revising their growth forecast for India. And they will be on the upper side rather than the lower side," he said. The NITI Aayog CEO also noted that growth is better in sectors where there is a Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme. "Growth is broadbased. It covers all sectors. The other interesting thing, wherever the growth is strong, you will have a PLI operational like metals, automotive, and food products. All the sectors which have PLI are actually showing a far better growth rate," he said. MoSPI Secretary Saurabh Garg said that a survey for the service sector enterprises will start from October 1 onwards and is expected to be completed in a few months.

BharatPe settles Rs 88-crore fund misappropriation case with Ashneer Grover

New Delhi: After a long-standing and dramatic courtroom battle, BharatPe on Monday said it has arrived at an agreement with its former co-founder Ashneer Grover, who was charged, along with his family members, by the fintech company for alleged misappropriation of funds worth Rs 88.67 crore. In a statement, the company said as part of the settlement, Grover will not be associated with BharatPe in any capacity, nor be a part of the shareholding of the company."Certain shares of Grover shall be transferred to the Resilient Growth Trust for the benefit of the company and his remaining shares will be managed by his family trust," said a company spokesperson.BharatPe further added that both parties have decided not to pursue the cases filed. "We wish Grover well. BharatPe continues to focus on delivering industry-leading solutions to its merchants and customers driving growth with profitability," the company added.In a post on X, Ashneer said he has "reached a decisive settlement with BharatPe". "I repose my faith in the management and board, who are doing great work in taking BharatPe forward in the right direction. I continue to remain aligned with the company's growth and success," he said."I will no longer be associated with BharatPe in any capacity, nor be part of the capital table. My remaining shares will be managed by my Family Trust. Both parties have decided not to pursue cases filed. I hope BharatPe continues to grow and succeed for the benefit of all its stakeholders," he posted.

Mahima Chaudhry requested Ajay Devgn to not tell anyone about her accident during Dil Kya Kare, wanted to 'salvage' her career: 'Ajay used to say...'



When Mahima Chaudhry made her debut in the 1997 film Pardes, she was the new star on the block and the actor had a bright future ahead of her. But in 1999, when she met with an accident during the shoot of Dil Kya Kare, Mahima went through a rather difficult time. In a recent interview, Mahima opened up about that time in her life when she actually started thinking of an alternate career as she believed that she wouldn't be able to continue as an actor.

Talking about the accident which led to 67 glass pieces being taken out of her face, Mahima told Radio Nasha that if the same thing happened today, she would be hailed as a hero and the industry would be supportive but this wasn't the culture in those days. "When my accident happened, I didn't realise that I have these many cuts on my face. I found later when I went to the bathroom and saw the mirror. Before that, I was telling Prakash ji (Prakash Jha, director) that if nothing has happened, let's shoot. Because doctors were done with the scans etc. He said, 'No no, let's wait, we'll just go out and talk about

dates.' When I saw my face, I realised that my face is injured." she said.

Mahima Chaudhry said that when her co-star and producer of the film Ajay Devgn and director Prakash Jha came back, she requested them to not tell anyone about her accident so she could save her career as she feared that if the news got out, she would be banished from the industry. "When Ajay and Prakash ji came back, my first thing was 'please don't tell anyone that I have gone through this. Let me at least try and see what I can salvage my career with.' It is just immense that no one from the production never told anyone. 20 years later, I told the story and that's when people got to know. It is commendable. I used to go on set and everyone could see it," she recalled.

Mahima shared that a film magazine printed her photo that they clicked secretly and called her "scarface" but apart from that, no one said anything. The actor recalled that she also signed a film with late director Satish Kaushik and actor Anil Kapoor but she walked out of that. When Anil visited her home, Mahima pretended that she had broken her foot so she didn't have to open up about her face. "That was tough because I was very young when I went through that," she recalled. Mahima said that at this time, she didn't think that she would come out of the accident. "Ajay used to say that after surgeries, it would all be fine but I didn't believe it. I was thinking of other career options. Even today, my one eye is smaller than the other. Back then, it was very stressful. I never faced the camera straight. I would always angle my face a bit," she shared. Mahima Chaudhry's accident happened in Bangalore when during an early morning shoot, a vehicle coming from the wrong side rammed into her car and the glass pieces got stuck in her face.

Materialising a Indian father's dream: Australian legspinner Vishwa Ramkumar torments India U-19

A dream that began in Chennai, while watching India's victorious World Series triumph in 1985, blossomed in Melbourne and is now beginning to take shape into a reality in Chennai again, the place of birth of Australia's promising leg-spinner Vishwa Ramkumar. As India Under-19 collapsed from 133/0 to 296 in response to Australia's first innings total of 293, it was the leg-spin of Vishwa, who picked up four wickets that did maximum damage on the second day of the first Youth Test at the MA Chidambaram Stadium.

And watching it from the stands was Vishwa's father Ramkumar, with his family and friends. Vishwa is living the dream of Ramkumar, who played league cricket in Chennai before preference to education put an end to his aspirations. "Cricket is the only thing that I knew, but back then I didn't have an option to choose between sports and education. So chartered accountancy became my calling," Ramkumar tells The Indian Express.But, the endearing image of Ravi Shastri taking the Audi for a spin at the Melbourne Cricket Ground after the World Series triumph had sowed seeds of inspiration in Ramkumar

"Coloured clothes, floodlights, packed stadiums and more importantly Bill Lawry, Richie Benaud and Tony Greig behind the mic...it was just fascinating for me and I told my family I'm going to settle down in Australia just to experience cricket. And I began chasing it," Ramkumar recalls. Vishwa Ramkumar For Vishwa, cricket has been the only constant in his life since he was 4, when started with backyard cricket. (Special Arrangement) After stopovers in Singapore, United States and New Zealand as a Chartered Accountant professional and then in the field of IT, Ramkumar would eventually move to Melbourne in

2006, two months before Vishwa was born. "I was always inspired by Australia because of what it did with cricket. It was always my destination and it also turned out to be the ideal place for Vishwa to grow into a cricketer as well."

For Vishwa, cricket has been the only constant in his life since he was 4, when started with backyard cricket. At 6, Ramkumar handed him a cricket ball and now it has become an inseparable part of his right hand. The reason to pick leg-spin as art to pursue wasn't a difficult one for Ramkumar already had an idol in mind for Vishwa to follow. "For anyone who grew up in the 90s, if it is batting, Sachin Tendulkar was the idol and spin bowling means Shane Warne. And moreover, when Vishwa started to bowl with the cricket ball, bowling came naturally to him," Ramkumar says. But he had to convince Vishwa, who being in the land of fast bowling, was naturally inclined to the sight of Australian fast bowlers hunting in packs. "He wanted to run in like them and bowl as fast as he could. But we have to be realistic because with our roots, he didn't have the physique to become a fast bowler. It comes naturally to Australians. You look at this team, he is the tiny one. So I encouraged him to bowl leg-spin," Ramkumar adds. And Vishwa's career graph since then has seen gradual progression. At 9 he featured in the Mitchell Shield tournament in Melbourne, then moved up to the Under-14s, with his pathway clearly established. "Because of his consistent ability to take wickets, he has moved through the ranks quickly. He has always played with boys who are senior to him and it has been grinding. But he has come through it all and is now part of the Victoria junior side," he says.

With cricket only being a summer sport in Australia, Ramkumar has been bringing Vishwa to Chennai over the last couple of years to get more exposure. He has had training sessions with a Bengaluru based club and last March was a net bowler during Chennai Super Kings' pre-season camp. "When I came here, I was just stunned by how much cricket Under-19 boys play here. They even get to practice 6-7 hours a day, which is not the case in Australia. In the off-season, we usually train only indoors. But nothing like a good game time. And you get good exposure to spin bowling coaches as well. We had one with VV Kumar and then obviously the stint with CSK was icing on the cake," Ramkumar says. With the ball, Vishwa is very much old-school sort of a leg-spinner, but one who has a long run-up almost like a medium-pacer. In the first innings, he repeatedly tested India's batsmen with his variations and walked away with four wickets.

'Outplayed': After a fairytale high in Pakistan, Bangladesh fall flat in India

Two weeks can at times feel like a year. Bangladesh had come to India on a high following their stunning 2-0 win over Pakistan. They came with a good fast bowling unit with one bowler clocking 150 kph, two world-class all-rounders in Shakib Al Hasan and Mehidy Hasan Miraz and a much-improved middle-order batting line-up. They indeed showed some fight in the opening two sessions at Chepauk but after that, it has been one-way traffic.On Tuesday, Bangladesh surrendered meekly as India completed a comprehensive seven-wicket win in the second Test to take the series 2-0 at the Green Park Stadium in Kanpur. It was India's 18th successive series win at home. The match was reduced to a three-day game after the second and third day of the Test had been washed out by rain and a wet outfield and only 35 overs were possible on the opening day. However, Bangladesh still could not take the match into the final session, with India bundling them out for 146 in the morning before chasing down the paltry 95-run target after lunch.

"This approach was not seen before and we did not react quickly. We couldn't react quickly enough. Credit to India and Rohit for their approach but the defeat has hurt us," he told reporters.Bangladesh lost eight wickets in the morning session. First-innings centurion Mominul was strangled down the leg-side by R Ashwin with KL Rahul taking a sharp catch. Skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto and opener Shadman Islam negotiated the early burst from Bumrah and Ashwin, adding 55 runs for the fourth wicket to give Bangladesh a glimmer of hope. But just after the drinks break after an hour of play on Day 5, the brain fade hit the Bangladesh batters. Najmul was cleaned up while trying to play a reverse sweep.

Once Jadeja broke the partnership by dismissing Shanto for 19, everything fell apart for Bangladesh as they lost four wickets in three runs to go from 91-3 to 94-7. Shadman fell to Akash Deep for 50, while Jadeja removed Liton Das and Shakib Al Hasan in quick succession. Shakib combusted tamely, patting a regulation floater back to Jadeja. Mushfiqur Rahim and Mehedi Hasan Miraz added 24 runs before the latter got caught behind off Bumrah for nine. Taijul Islam was pinned by Bumrah, and with just one wicket to go, the morning session got



extended by 30 minutes. Mushfigur, who nearly took Bangladesh into the next session, was undone by Bumrah in the final ball of the session. Only Bumrah could have sensed that Mushfigur would be gunning for a slog off the last ball and slipped in a slower ball; perhaps only Mushfigur could have gone for such a shot off the last ball."We have not been performing well with the bat in the last few series'. The batting also depends on the quality of the opposition we are facing. India is the toughest to face and we know we are lacking but we are aware of it and we'll improve," said Hathurusinghe. "We were outplayed in the series. I came to India in 2017 and now in 2024, I can say how much improvement they have achieved. India has a proper system, Bangladesh also needs to put that in place." "We knew how Yashavi (Jaiswal) was going to play but Rohit walked out and tonked the first ball for a six and when you walk the talk, the dressing room obviously doesn't have many other choice but to follow that pattern. We were 50 runs in 3 overs and there was no looking back after that."

Jasprit Bumrah (3/17), and Ravindra Jadeja (3/34) and R Ashwin (3/50) had each taken three wickets to help bundle Bangladesh out for 146. Chasing 95 for victory, India finished on 98 for 3 in 17.2 overs, with Yashasvi Jaiswal (51) scoring another quickfire half-century in the match. Future pillars of Indian batting Ashwin has showered praise on both Shubman Gill and Yashasvi Jaiswal. Gill had scored a terrific century in the second innings of

the first Test, while Jaiswal completed the series with three half-centuries to his name. "Yashasvi Jaiswal is a special talent. He has started his international career, so has Shubman Gill," said Ashwin. "I would say both of them are in their formative years of playing the Test cricket. But I do see that both of them are the future pillars of Indian cricket," he said.

"Overseas tour that we will encounter shortly will enhance and enrich their experience going forward in their wonderful Test journey. They both are special, it's just they need to encounter new experiences in order to identify for themselves what they need to do. The raw material is there and it is pretty evident for everybody as they are high quality cricketers," he said. A well-oiled bowling attack

A lot has been spoken about how India brought the T20 onslaught in Test cricket on Day 4 to get them closer to the victory. But it was India's five bowlers, who between them shared 20 wickets in 123.2 overs in a rainaffected match. "Each one of those bowlers that bowl along with me, alongside me, have the ability to hold on to a game, bowl with discipline and yet produce wicket-taking balls. It is not just their ability alone, it is also the belief of the entire team. When Rohit says that you make 400, try and make a game out of it, it tells you that the captain believes his bowlers will get the job done," said Ashwin. "These bowlers have done it day in and day out. And they have the ability to pick 20 wickets. In the future, you will encounter situations where opponent batters will dominate against our bowling attack. But this bowling attack is quite special. And I really do hope that this legacy of bowling is taken forward," he added. 
Baseball legend Pete Rose dies at the age of 83

New Delhi: Pete Rose, baseball's all-time leader in hits, dies at the age of 83, at the Clark County medical examiner in Nevada.Rose, known as "Charlie Hustle" passed with the distinction of being both Major League Baseball's (MLB) all-time hits leader 4,256 career hits, a record that still stands, and on its permanently ineligible list for betting on Cincinnati Reds games. "The Reds are heartbroken to learn of the passing of baseball legend Pete Rose," the Cincinnati Reds said in a post on X.

"Major League Baseball extends its deepest condolences to Pete Rose's family, his friends across the game, and the fans of his hometown of Cincinnati, Philadelphia, Montreal and beyond who admired his greatness, grit and determination on the field of play. May he rest in peace," MLB said in a statement. A Cincinnati native who became a franchise icon for the Reds, Rose is the club's all-time leader in games (2,722), plate appearances (12,344), runs (1,741), hits (3,358), singles (2,490), doubles (601) and walks (1,210). Over his 24-year career that spanned from 1963-86 and saw him also play for the Phillies and Expos, Rose collected 4,256 hits.

"Our hearts are deeply saddened by the news of Pete's passing. He was one of the fiercest competitors the game has ever seen, and every team he played for was better because of him. Pete was a Red through and through. No one loved the game more than Pete and no one loved Pete more than Reds Country. We must never forget what he accomplished," said Bob Castellini, Reds principal owner and managing partner. Rose's career spanned from 1963 to 1986, mostly with the Cincinnati Reds, where he was a key part of the "Big Red Machine" that won back-to-back World Series titles in 1975 and 1976. He also won three batting titles (1968, '69 & '73), one National League Most Valuable Player Award (1973), two Gold Glove Awards (1969, '70), NL Rookie of the Year Award (1963) and 1975 World Series MVP.In 1999, Rose was named to the Major League Baseball All-Century Team. A 17-time All-Star, Rose also clinched a third championship with the Philadelphia Phillies in 1980.He



retired with a .303 lifetime average, winning three batting titles. Despite his on-field success, Rose's legacy was marred by a gambling scandal.In 1989, he was banned from baseball for life after it was revealed that he had bet on games while managing the Reds. Though he denied the allegations for years, Rose admitted in 2004 that he had gambled on baseball, though never against his team.Rose was inducted into the Reds Hall of Fame in 2016 and his iconic No. 14 was retired the same year. His statue outside Great American Ball Park was dedicated in 2017.Rose's passing was mourned by many in the baseball world. Former New York Yankee Wade Boggs wrote, "Words can't describe how I feel right now. My idol and friend. You'll be dearly missed."

We were willing to get all out for 100, says Rohit Shama on India's boldplay in Kanpur Test

Kanpur: India were willing to take the risk of being bowled for 100-odd in its bold push for a result in the weather-hit second Test against Bangladesh, said Rohit Sharma after the hosts pulled off a dramatic win here on Tuesday.India managed to win the game comfortably on day five despite two full days were lost due to wet outfield at the Green Park Stadium. Even on day one, only 35 overs possible.

After bowling out Bangladesh for 233, India batted in T20 mode to smash 285 in 34.4 overs before declaring their first innings. Having lost two batters overnight, Bangladesh were bowled out in their second innings at stroke of lunch and India ended the game in the second session. "Once we lost two and a half days, when we came on day 4 we wanted to get them out as quickly as possible and see what we can do with the bat. When they got bowled out for 230, it wasn't about the runs we get but the overs we got at them," said Rohit at the post-match presentation.

"To make a game out of it on that pitch was a superb effort. It was a risk we were willing to take because when you're trying to bat like that, you can be bundled out for a low score. But we were ready for it even if we got bowled out for 100-120. It was India's record extending 18th series win in a row at home. Among the new players, Rohit was pleased by Akash Deep's relentless effort.

"He's been good (Akash Deep). Lot of domestic cricket he has played. When you come up through the ranks like that, there are a lot of overs in the legs. He has the quality and the skill. Good body as well – can bowl long spells. You have to make sure you prepare your bench strength," said the skipper.

It was the first Test series under new head coach Gautam Gambhir who overtook the responsibility from Rahul Dravid. "We had a fantastic time (with Dravid) but life moves on. Gautam Gambhir, I've played with him and know what sort of mindset he comes in with," said Rohit. Ashwin was named player of the series for his all-round

show. He rated the improbable win was "massive" in the context of World Test Championship. "When we bowled them out yesterday, it was little after lunch. Rohit was

keen that we needed 80 overs to bowl at them.

"And the moment he came inside out and gave that talk where we're going to go after it even if we get out under 230. It's not only him saying it, he went out there and hit his first ball for six. He set the tone that way," said the premier spinner. Opposition skipper Najmul Hasan Shanto said that team's batting through the two Test series let them down. "Both the Tests we didn't bat well. In these conditions we need to bat well. If you look at our batters – we played 30-40 balls and got out. It's important in a Test match, when batsmen get in, you should look to score big runs," said Shanto.

"The way Ashwin and Jaddu batted at that time (in Chennai after India were six down) – they batted really well. As a bowling unit we need to look at those moments – how we can get those wickets. That partnership cost us that game," added Shanto.
